## THE WHITE HOUSE

The President today announced his intention to nominate ten persons to be Representatives and Alternate Representatives to serve on the United States Delegation to the Seventh Special Session and the Thirtieth Session of the General Assembly of the United Nations.

Ambassador Daniel Patrick Moynihan will head the delegation. The Representatives are Ambassador W. Tapley Bennett, Jr.; Congressman Donald M. Fraser of Minnesota; Congressman J. Herbert Burke of Florida; and Mr. Clarence M. Mitchell, Jr., of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People.

The Alternate Representatives are Ambassador Albert W. Sherer, Jr.; Mr. Jacob M. Meyerson, Deputy Chief of the United States Mission to the European Communities; Ambassador Barbara M. White; Ms. Carmen Maymi, Director of the Women's Bureau in the Department of Labor; and Mr. John H. Haugh of Arizona.

The Seventh Special Session, scheduled to begin in New York September 1, will last about two weeks. It will consider development and international economic cooperation. The regular annual meeting of the General Assembly will begin September 16 and continue through mid-December.
