POCL REPORT: Pool #8 - Trammel Crow Residence

The President motorcaded from Covention Hall through Turtle Creek Parkway to a fashionable, distinctly high rent neighborhood which was described as Dallas' "Old Money Section". . . Highland Park.

From the beginning John Connally took his place beside the President and was never far away.

Ford mingled with the guests at the \$1000 a couple luncheon, as a Dixieland band played on a terrace shaded by live Cak and Magnolia trees. The house was a sprawling beige brick and stucco mansion with an expanse of lawn that stretched, literally, as far as the eye could see. A dozen tables covered with striped cloths centered with elephants and red carnations were scattered about the lawn.

At the President's table were Mr. and Mrs. Trammel Crow; former Governor and Mrs. Connally; Governor and Mrs. Christopher Bond of Missouri; Ray Hutchison and his son. They lunched on barbecued beef, artichokes, and assorted cold things. There were no remarks by the President. There were occasional rain drops.

On the drive from the Crow residence to SMU the motorcade proceeded at speed limit. There were clusters of well-wishers on the corners as we passed through the residential areas. They were friendly and curious but not overly demonstrative.
