Monterey to San Francisco

Ford left the Firestone residence at 9:30 a.m. for the 15-minute motor-cade to the Monterey Airport. Uneventful trip. There was a small crowd -- only 50 or so -- at the airport on this damp and dreary morning.

(One leftover from last night on the return trip to Monterey from Disneyland and the speech to the insurancemen. Ford remained on board Air Force One for 20 minutes after the plane landed. Nessen explained that he was doing some work on the energy speech today to the Building Trades Convention. The trip force was uneventful and the President was back at the Firestone home around 11:30 p.m.)

On Air Force One, Nessen said the EIA legislation would go to the Hill soon but no specific date given. Nessen said more decisions have to be made regarding details on EIA and the speech was written with that in mind.

Nessen said Ford talked to Nixon yesterday from the Firestone home. He talked to Nixon for five minutes. Nessen said he didn't have a chance to check it out until today, thus the late word. Nessen didn't know the specifics or the subject matter discussed on the Nixon call. He characterized it as a private conversation. The call was made after lunch yesterday before he left for Stanford.
