Sir:

I have the honor to submit for your consideration a proposed appropriation language change which would extend the availability of funds already appropriated for the National Commission on Supplies and Shortages. The details are as follows:

OTHER INDEPENDENT AGENCIES

National Commission on
Supplies and Shortages

Salaries and Expenses

Funds appropriated under this heading in the Supplemental Appropriations Act, 1975, shall remain available until October 1, 1976.

This proposed language change would permit the \$287,500 appropriated in the Supplemental Appropriations Act, 1975, for expenses of the National Commission on Supplies and Shortages to remain available until October 1, 1976. This provision is consistent with recently enacted legislation (Public Law 94-72, approved August 5, 1975) which extended the final reporting date and the authorization for appropriations from December 31, 1975, until October 1, 1976.
