These requests would provide the funds to prepare an environmental impact statement, as required by the National Environmental
Policy Act, for an oil pipeline proposed to be constructed by
Standard Oil of Ohio (SOHIO) to carry oil from Los Angeles to
Midland, Texas. A surplus of oil on the West Coast is anticipated after oil begins to flow from Alaska in late 1977 or 1978.
The Department of the Interior will be reimbursed in full for
this work by SOHIO.
