I have the honor to submit for your consideration proposed supplemental appropriations in the amount of \$1,000,000 for the fiscal year 1976, \$250,000 for the transition quarter, and an amendment to the request transmitted in the budget for the fiscal year 1977 involving an increase in the amount of \$400,000 for the Arms Control and Disarmament Agency, as follows:

The supplemental appropriations are required to support the extended negotiations of the Strategic Arms Limitation Talks with the Soviet Union and to undertake certain activities and studies required by the recently enacted amendments to the Arms Control and Disarmament Act. The budget amendment provides for continuation of these latter activities and studies in 1977.

I have carefully reviewed these budget requests and I am satisfied that they are necessary at this time. I recommend, therefore, that these proposals be transmitted to the Congress.
