THE WHITE HOUSE

The President today announced his intention to nominate John H. Holloman, III, of Jackson, Mississippi, for reappointment as a member of the Federal Power Commission for the term expiring June 22, 1981. He was appointed to this position on August 5, 1975.

Born on March 5, 1937, in Columbus, Mississippi, and received his B. A. degree from the University of Mississippi in 1959. He attended the University of Mississippi School of Law and received his LL. B. degree in 1961.

Beginning in 1960 until 1964, Mr. Holloman was a member of the Mississippi House of Representatives representing Lowndes County. From 1961 to 1964, he was a partner in the law firm of Holloman & Holloman, of Columbus, Mississippi. He served on the legal staff of the United States Senate Judiciary Committee beginning in 1964 and became Staff Director and Chief Counsel in 1967. He joined the law firm of Jolly, Holloman & Miller, of Jackson, Mississippi in 1973.

Mr. Holloman is married to the former Ann Scales Klaus, and they have two children.
