WHEN I RECEIVED YOUR INVITATION TO SPEAK THIS AFTERNOON, AS A JOURNALIST, I WAS STRUCK BY THE FACT THAT, INDEED OUR TWO PROFESSIONS HAVE AN INTERESTING SIMILARITY -- AS JOURNALISTS AND ATTORNEYS OUR MOST ESSENTIAL PROFESSIONAL TOOLS ARE WORDS -- I'VE KNOWN YOU LAWYERS TO USE THEM WITH THE PRECISION OF A SURGEON WITH A SCALPEL IN HIS HAND TO CUT TO THE HEART OF AN ISSUE WHICH MAY, TOO, MAKE THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN LIFE AND DEATH! AND I, AS A REPORTER, OUT ON THE BEAT IN NEW YORK COVERING THE NEWS OF THE DAY HAVE IN THOSE MOMENTS AFTER PUTTING THE FINAL TOUCHES ON A STORY THAT I FELT GOOD ABOUT, LOOKED UPON THE JOURNALIST IC ART AS THAT OF TRYING TO PAINT A PICTURE FROM A PALLET

BUT IN THINKING ABOUT SOME OF THE ISSUES THAT I WOULD :

STRIKING TO ME THAT I HAD TO LOOK NO FURTHER THAN THE TRADITIONAL TITLES USED FOR MEMBERS OF YOUR PROFESSION, TO FIND THE WORD THAT WOULD BE MOST APPROPRIATE AS THE KEYNOTE FOR MY COMMENTS TODAY. THAT WORD IS "ADVOCATE." TODAY, I WISH TO CHALLENGE YOU AS ADVOCATES, TO TAKE UP A MORE VISIBLE ROLE IN YOUR COMMUNITIES AS ADVOCATES OF SOCIAL ISSUES THAT AFFECT OUR SOCIAL, ECONOMIC AND POLITICAL NEEDS AS BLACKS. FOR YOU WHO THRIVE ON ISSUES. THE FIELD IS FUTILE. THE CONDITION OF OUR HOUSING. THE QUALITY OF OUR SCHOOLS, THE MANAGEMENT AND COMPOSITION OF OUR POLICE FORCE, AND THE "WHY" OF DISPROPORTIONATELY HIGH POPULATIONS OF BLACKS IN OUR LOCAL, STATE AND entral en combinario de la Meiro de Carlos el Carlos de La Carlos de Carlos de Carlos de Carlos de Carlos de C

WHEN WE LOOK TO THE ORIGINS OF THE WORD "ADVOCATE,"

WE FIND IT ROOTED IN LATIN IN THE COMPANY OF ALL THOSE

OTHER LATIN PHRASES THAT YOU LAWYERS LIKE TO REVERT TO

WHEN ALL ELSE IS LOSS. THE LATIN WORD ADVOCARE -- MEANT

TO SUMMON TO ONE'S ASSISTANCE, WHEN USED AS A NOUN, IT DESCRIBES ONE WHO ASSISTS, DEFENDS, OR PLEADS FOR ANOTHER. IN ITS ACTION FORM, THE VERB "ADVOCATE" --YOUR WEBSTER, MR. BLACK, MAKES MY POINT FOR ME; THE ADVOCATE IS THE ONE WHO SPEAKS OUT ON ISSUES, LENDS SUPPORT, VINDICATES OR RECOMMENDS PUBLICLY HIS STAND -- OR THAT OF HIS CLIENT OR ORGANIZATION. IT'S THE JOURNALIST IN ME, I GUESS, THAT KEEPS ME ALWAYS ON THE PROWL FOR GOOD COPY. RIGHT HERE IN THIS AUDIENCE SITS MANY OF THE BEST AND MOST FINELY LEARNED LEGAL MINDS IN THIS COUNTRY. I WANT TO HEAR, AND I KNOW THAT BLACK LAW STUDENTS, POTENTIAL LAW STUDENTS AND BLACK PEOPLE EVERY-WHERE WANT TO HEAR WHAT YOU HAVE TO SAY ABOUT THE PLIGHT OF BLACKS WHO ARE THE FIRST FIRED WHEN A NATIONAL CRISIS The control of the co BLACK PRISONERS ARE LOOKING FOR A SPOKESMAN TO NEGOTIATE THEIR INTERESTS.

I CAN APPRECIATE THAT IT CAN POSE A BURDEN TO ASSUME SUCH A ROLE, WHEN THERE ARE ONLY 4-5,000 BLACK ATTORNEYS OF THE MORE THAN 300,000 ATTORNEYS IN THIS COUNTRY. BUT AS BLACKS, WE ALL KNOW THAT IT HAS OFTEN BEEN THE CASE THAT WHILE WE MAY LACK NUMBERS TO PRESS AN ISSUE, WHAT WE CAN ACHIEVE BY PURE ARDOR HAS BEEN PROVEN BEYOND A REASONABLE DOUBT WHEN WE LOOK BACK OVER THE LAST TWENTY YEARS SINCE YOU, THE BLACK ATTORNEYS, FROM TOPEKA TO PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY, MARYLAND LEAD US VICTORIOUSLY TO THE SUPREME COURT IN BROWN vs THE BOARD OF EDUCATION. YET IT'S YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO INSPIRE AND TANGIBLY HELP THOSE CHILDREN WHO TWENTY YEARS AFTER, BROWN STILL KNOW WHAT IT MEANS TO GET A QUALITY EDUCATION -- OR HAVE AN EQUAL OPPORTUNITY TO GET A DECENT JOB -- MUCH LESS TO GO TO LAW SCHOOL.

AS I MET MANY OF THE MEMBERS OF YOUR YOUNG LAWYERS
SECTION OF THE NBA, I HAVE NO FEAR THAT YOU'LL HAVE PLENTY

OF HELP. THESE YOUNG MEN AND WOMEN WHO HAVE ENJOYED THE FORTUNE OF HAVING INFINITELY MORE DOORS OPENED TO THEM THAN THOSE OF US IN THE "39 AND HOLDING" SET. WILL NOT ALLOW YOU TO BE SATISFIED WITH RESTING ON YOUR ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE PAST. THE RANKS OF WELL-TRAINED BLACK LAWYERS ARE INCREASING AT AN ASTONISHING RATE. I WAS SURPRISED TO LEARN FROM COMMENTS BY PROFESSOR HARRY EDWARDS IN A LAW STUDENT PUBLICATION OF THE UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN, THAT IN 1972, THERE WERE MORE THAN 4,000 BLACKS STUDYING LAW ACROSS THE COUNTRY -- A FIGURE WHICH THEN ALMOST ECLIPSED THE ESTIMATED TOTAL NUMBER OF BLACK ATTORNEYS THEN PRACTICING AT THE BAR. NEEDED WHEN WE CONSIDER THAT YOU NUMBER 1 TO 5,000 BLACKS AND MEETING THE NEEDS OF THE COMMUNITY SHOULD CERTAINLY BE OF THE HIGHEST PRIORITY. MY STINT IN GOVERNMENT SERVICE HAS FORCEFULLY DRIVEN HOME THE POINT THAT OUR INTERESTS AS BLACKS ARE NOT BEING FULLY REPRESENTED WITHIN THE FACTIONS OF POWER WHERE DECISIONS ARE MADE OVER LUNCH WHICH MAY AFFECT THE JOBS OF THOUSANDS OF BLACKS. THUS, THE HEAVY CONCENTRATION OF BLACK ATTORNEYS IN THESE AREAS TO THE EXCLUSION OF SUCH AREAS AS TAX, ANTI-TRUST, BANKING, CORPORATE, LABOR AND ADMINISTRATIVE LAW -- HAS LEFT BLACKS BADLY UNDER REPRESENTED -- TRUE BY A LONG AND BITTER HISTORY OF DISCRIMINATION, IN THESE AREAS OF LAW WHERE SPECIALIZATION CAN BE PROFITABLE NOT ONLY IN A PECUNIARY SENSE BUT IN TERMS OF THE FACT THAT IT DENIES TO THOSE WHO DOMINATE THESE AREAS, A BLACK PERSPECTIVE AND TO BLACKS



ANY FORCEABLE REPRESENTATION IN THOSE SPHERES OF
ACTIVITY WHICH ARE AT THE VERY HEART OF THE DECISIONMAKING PROCESS.

I WOULD AGREE WITH THOSE WHO POINT OUT THAT IF THE INCREASING NUMBER OF HIGHLY CAPABLE BLACK ATTORNEYS WHO ARE GRADUATING EACH YEAR FROM DISTINGUISHED LAW SCHOOLS ALL OVER THE COUNTRY---WHICH 20 YEARS AGO HAD. ONLY A TOKEN NUMBER OF BLACKS IF ANY---WERE TO GO INTO THE CORPORATE LAW, THE NEED FOR BLACK ADVOCACY IN THE COURTS WOULD BE EVEN MORE SERIOUS. BUT I WOULD AT LEAST LIKE TO SEE THE NBA DOING ALL THAT IT CAN TO RESOLVE THE DILEMMA OF SMALL NUMBERS OF BLACKS TO REPRESENT THE Proceedings of the State of the Commission of th INTERESTS OF BLACKS IN CRIMINAL, CIVIL, OR DOMESTIC RELATIONS BUT, I THINK THAT WE AS A RACE HAVE BECOME SOPHISTICATED ENOUGH TO KNOW THAT WITH POWER COMES te be doubt of the published for the world of the state of the first providing the state of the MORE POWER AND AFTER ALL. HASN'T OUR STRUGGLE FOR THE LAST TWO DECADES BEEN ALL ABOUT OUR REFUSAL TO BE

EXCLUDED FROM THE CITADELS OF POWER. IF WE HAVE A CONSTITUTIONALLY GUARANTEED RIGHT TO VOTE. WE DEMAND TO BE ABLE TO VOTE WITHOUT HARASSMENT: IF WE HAVE A RIGHT TO SHARE IN THE WEALTH OF THE COUNTRY, EARNED BY LONG YEARS OF TOIL IN THE DIRTIEST AND MOST DIFFICULT JOBS. BIG BUSINESS CAN AFFORD TO FUNCTION WITHOUT TAKING OUR INTEREST INTO CONSIDERATION. WE TOO, CAN PLAY THE ROLE OF POWER BROKERS! MY TRAINING. AS AN OBJECTIVE REPORTER OF HOW THE CHIPS FALL IN OUR SOCIETY, ALLOW ME TO EDITORIALIZE A BIT AND SAY THAT THERE WOULD BE NO MORE QUALIFIED BLACK PROFESSIONALS TO CHAMPION THE SOCIAL NEEDS OF BLACKS THAN THOSE OF YOU WHO SIT HERE nergini ang agusang pagini ang iliga nagaring ang mangang pagini ang agarin ang kangang nagarin na ing nagarin IN THIS ROOM. MINDS ARE BEING TRAINED EVERY DAY. LET'S NOT LIMIT OUR

ADVOCACY TO THOSE LEGAL JOBS THAT YOUR MAJORITY COUNTERPARTS ARE TOO BUSY MAKING MONEY AND DECISIONS ABOUT

STOCK OPTIONS TO CARE ABOUT OR KNOW HOW TO DEAL WITH

AS WE BLACKS. COULD IT BE THAT THOSE BLACKS WHO SAY THEY

PREFER A WHITE LAWYER, FEEL THAT THE BLACK LAWYER IS

"POWERLESS" TO REPRESENT HIS INTEREST WHEN CONFRONTING

A CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM THAT HAS NOT YET CONVINCED

THE BLACK COMMUNITY THAT IT DOESN'T MEET A DIFFERENT

BRAND OF "JUSTICE" TO BLACK OFFENDERS THAN TO WHITE

OFFENDERS?

THE LIMITED NUMBERS OF BLACK ADVOCATES BE IN MORE THAN ONE
PLACE AT ONE TIME, THEN OBVIOUSLY THE ANSWER IS TO INCREASE
THE NUMBER OF BLACK ATTORNEYS - AS I HAVE NOTED - THIS

IS HAPPENING IN WELCOMED PROPORTIONS EACH JUNE AS



HUNDREDS OF BLACK GRADUATES LEAVE LAW SCHOOL. I
RECOGNIZE THE DIFFICULTIES BLACKS ARE HAVING PASSING
THE BAR IN MANY STATES. IN MY OWN AREA, THE DISTRICT
OF COLUMBIA, BLACK LAW SCHOOL GRADUATES ARE TAKING
THEIR CASE TO COURT. WILL THE NBA BE THERE WITH THEM IF
THEIR CASE HAS MERIT? HAS THE NBA CONTACTED THE STATE
EXAMINERS WHERE THE GRADUATES ARE CHARGING THAT THERE
IS EVIDENCE OF A "PATTERN OR PRACTICE" OF DISCRIMINATION.
AS A LAYMAN, AND JOURNALIST IT IS MY JOB TO ASK! IT IS
YOUR JOB TO GIVE ME AND THE BLACK COMMUNITY ANSWERS.

CERTAINLY THOSE YOUNG BLACK LAW STUDENTS AND LAWYERS

WHO ARE COMING OUT OF LAW SCHOOL READY AND EAGER TO PLY

THEIR TRADE MUST CERTAINLY WANT TO LOOK TO YOU, THE

PROFESSIONALS WHO ARE EXPERIENCED IN YOUR ART, FOR THE

KIND OF STRONG LEADERSHIP THAT THOSE OF US WHO ARE LAYMEN

DEPEND ON YOU FOR WHETHER YOU REPRESENT OUR INTEREST IN



THE COURT ROOM, CITY HALL, THE STATE LEGISLATURE, THE CONGRESS, OR THE CORPORATE BOARD ROOM.

FOR AS ADVOCATES, WHO ARE IN THE TRUEST SENSE THE REPRESENTATIVES OF YOUR RACE, I WOULD ASK THAT YOU RECALL THESE EXCERPTS FROM THE PREAMBLE OF THE LEGAL CODE OF PROFESSIONAL RESPONSIBILITY -

"LAWYERS, AS GUARDIANS OF THE LAW, PLAY A VITAL
ROLE IN THE PRESERVATION OF SOCIETY......

"THE CONTINUED EXISTENCE OF A FREE AND DEMOCRATIC
SOCIETY DEPENDS UPON THE RECOGNITION OF THE CONCEPT
THAT JUSTICE IS BASED UPON THE RULE OF LAW, GROUNDED
IN RESPECT FOR THE DIGNITY OF THE INDIVIDUAL AND HIS
CAPACITY THROUGH REASON FOR ENLIGHTENED SELFGOVERNMENT. LAW SO GROUNDED MAKES JUSTICE
POSSIBLE, FOR ONLY THROUGH SUCH LAW DOES THE DIGNITY
OF THE INDIVIDUAL ATTAIN RESPECT AND PROTECTION. WITHOUT
IT, INDIVIDUAL RIGHTS BECOME SUBJECT TO UNRESTRAINED

POWER, RESPECT FOR LAW IS DESTROYED, AND RATIONAL SELF-GOVERNMENT IS IMPOSSIBLE."

I WOULD ONLY ADD, THAT IT IS TO YOU LAWYERS TO WHOM
THE BLACK COMMUNITY HAS ALWAYS LOOKED TO TAKE OUR CASE
TO THE COURT HOUSE; NOW THAT MANY OF YOU SIT IN THOSE
SAME COURT HOUSES AS JUDGES, I CHALLENGE YOU TO BE
CERTAIN NOT ONLY THAT YOU REPRESENT US WELL AND LOUD,
BUT THAT YOU LET US BE ASSURED THAT YOU, AS MEMBERS
OF THE NBA WILL BE IN THE FOREFRONT, READY NOT ONLY TO
SHAPE THE BODY OF LAW TO THE EVER-CHANGING RELATIONSHIPS OF SOCIETY - BUT TO CHANGE SOCIETY IN SUCH A WAY
THAT WHEN ANOTHER BLACK OFFENDER IN THE D. C. JAIL LOOKS
AT A COPY OF THE COMPLAINT AGAINST HIM, THEIR WON'T BE



SUCH A TONE IN HIS VOICE AS HE SAYS TO HIS LAWYER, "LOOK AT THIS, THE WHOLE COUNTRY IS AGAINST ME. IT SAYS RIGHT HERE IN BLACK AND WHITE, THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA vs. JOSEPH JONES, I AIN'T GOT A CHANCE!!! I'M COUNTING ON YOU TO GIVE JOE A CHANCE!!!

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
