THIS ATMOSPHERE OF MUTUAL RESPECT AND UNDERSTANDING AROSE, AS I UNDERSTAND, FROM THE FACT THAT NO ONE DECEIVED OR TRIED TO DECEIVE ANYONE ELSE, SO THAT THE POSITIONS WERE MADE PERFECTLY CLEAR AT ALL THE MEETINGS, WHETHER FORMAL OR INFORMAL. THE OUTSPOKEN FRANKNESS WHICH CHARACTERIZED

THE INFORMAL MEETINGS MADE THEM AS IMPORTANT OR MORE SO THAN THE OFFICIAL ONES.

ON RETURNING TO BRASILIA, I FOUND THAT THE AGENDA FOR THE WORK OF THE PLANNING GROUPS FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE AND THE ITAMARATY, ON THE 21ST AND 22ND, HAD BEEN PRACTICALLY ESTABLISHED. I SEE THAT THE PREDOMINATING INTENTION ON THE UNITED STATES SIDE IS THAT OF MAKING A KIND OF "TOUR DIHORIZON" OF THE CURRENT PROBLEMS OF GLO-BAL POLICY. I FIND THIS EXCHANGE OF VIEWPOINTS TO BE OF THE HIGHEST UTILITY: IT IS MY IMPRESSION, HOWEVER, THAT WE SHOULD NOT FAIL TO DEVOTE SOME TIME, POSSIBLY TOWARDS THE END OF THE CONVERSATIONS, TO AN EVALUATION OF THE BILATERAL RELATIONS BETWEEN OUR TWO COUNTRIES. THE AMERICAN AND BRAZILIAN REPRESENTATIVES SHOULD EXAMINE, WITH THE MOST ABSOLUTE FRANKNESS, THE PRESENT STATE, THE PROSPECTS AND THE POSSIBILITIES OF THAT RELATIONSHIP. I THINK IT IS OF SPECIAL IMPORTANCE THAT THERE SHOULD PRE-VAIL THE UTMOST FRANKNESS IN THIS DIALOGUE, EACH PARTY BEING AWARE THAT THE POSSIBILITIES OF COOPERATIONS AND CONVERGENCE WILL BE ALL THE MORE REALISTIC WHEN RESULTING FROM WELL-UNDERSTOOD NATIONAL INTERESTS AND NOT FROM AUTOMATIC ALIGNMENTS THAT SHOULD NOT PREVAIL BETWEEN OUR TWO COUNTRIES.

I UNDERSTAND THAT THESE CONVERSATIONS WILL BE ONLY A PRELUDE TO YOUR VISIT TO BRAZIL EARLY NEXT YEAR. DEFICIT FINANCING THROUGH THE IMF. WEBER SAID THAT THE CHANCELLOR'S INITIAL REACTION TO THE US PROPOSALS HAD BEEN QUITE RESERVED, BUT THAT HE, WEBER, HAD NOT AS YET HAD A REPORT ON STATE SECRETARY POEHL'S LATEST DISCUSSION OF THE US PROPOSALS WITH THE CHANCELLOR.

2. WEBER MENTIONED THE FOLLOWING FACTORS (IN ORDER OF IMPORTANCE) AS HAVING LED TO HIS MINISTRY'S NEGATIVE RECOMMENDATION ON THE US PROPOSALS:

(A) WITH EVERY PRESENTATION THE US PROPOSALS SEEMED TO TIE AID OUT OF THE \$25 BILLION SOLIDARITY FUND MORE AND MORE EXCLUSIVELY TO COOPERATIVE BEHAVIOR IN ENERGY CONSERVATION AND LESS AND LESS TO STRICT ENFORCEMENT OF GENERAL SOUND ANTI-INFLATIONARY ECONOMIC PROGRAMS OF THE RECIPIENT COUNTRIES. BUT IN THE GERMAN VIEW INSISTENCE ON OVERALL STABILITY PROGRAMS WAS OF CRUCIAL IMPORTANCE IN THE CASE OF SUCH LIKELY BENEFICIARIES OF RECYCLING AID AS ITALY.

(B) THE MAGNITUDE OF THE US PROPOSAL SCARED THE GERMANS. IT WOULD BE POLITICALLY DIFFICULT FOR THEM IN VIEW OF THE HUGE INCREASE IN GOVERNMENT DEBT ALREADY SLATED FOR NEXT YEAR AND WOULD GIVE SOME OF THE WEAKER COUNTRIES SUCH A SENSE OF SAFETY AS TO MAKE NECESSARY STABILIZATION POLICIES BY THEM THAT MUCH MORE UNLIKELY. THE GERMANS ASSUMED THAT IF OUR PORPOSAL WAS ADOPTED THERE WOULD IN ADDITION ALSO BE SOME WITTEVEN II/HEALY TYPE OF FINANCING AND A GENERAL QUOTA INCREASE IN THE IMF. 1. FOREIGN MINISTER MIYAZAWA MET WITH DEPUTY SECRETARY AND SENIOR DEPARTMENT OFFICERS ON APRIL 10 FOR GENERAL TOUR D'HORIZON. FOLLOWING IS SUMMARY OF PRINCIPAL ISSUES DISCUSSED:

2. VIETNAM: FOLLOWING CANDID REVIEW BY US SIDE OF POLITICAL AND MILITARY SITUATIONS IN VIETNAM, MIYAZAWA OUT-LINED JAPAN'S NEGOTIATIONS WITH HANOI WHICH WEREVIRTUALLY COMPLETED LAST FEBRUARY AFTER SEVERAL YEARS. HE NOTED THAT GOJ HAD AGREED TO PAY REPARATIONS EUPHEMISTICALLY DESCRIBED AS ECONOMIC COOPERATION; PAYMENT WOULD BE IN KIND AND IN TWO CUTS - AMOUNTING TO \$17 MILLION AND \$30 MILLION.GOJ HAD ALSO AGREED TO RECIPROCAL EXCHANGE OF EMBASSIES 91"H HANOI. ON REPRESENTATIONS FROM US, GOJ HAD DEFERRED SIGNING OF AGREEMENTS AND DRV REPRESENTATIVES HAD RETURNED TO HANOI, BUT MIYAZAWA DID NOT BELIEVE HE COULD DEFER SIGNING MUCH LONGER. HE ARGUED JAPAN WOULD NOT INCLUDE WAR

MATERIAL IN AID PACKAGE AND POINTED OUT JAPANESE EMBASSY IN HANGI COULD PROVIDE US WITH ADDITIONAL CHANNEL FOR COMMUNICATION AND INTELLIGENCE. US SIDE URGED HECONTINUE TO DEFER SIGNING ON GROUNDS HANGI WAS CURRENTLY INVOLVED IN DIRECT AGGRESSION IN VIOLATIONOF PARISACCORDS.

3. MIDEAST: US SIDE DESCRIBED PRESENT STATUS OF MIDEAST NEGOTIATIONS. MIYAZAWA DEMONSTRATED GOOD KNOWLEDGE OF DYNAMICS OF SITUATION BUT DID NOT OFFER ANYCOMMENTS BEYOND APPRECIATION OF US EFFORTS TO BRING PEACE.

4. MTN: US SIDE URGED JAPANESE TO RECONSIDER THEIR ATTITUDE ON AGRICULTURAL PROBLEMS (THEY HAVE TENDED TO SUPPORT EC COUNTRIES ON THIS MATTER). MIYAZAWASOUGHT TO CLARIFY WHAT US DESIRED OF JAPAN BUT ADDED GOJHAS SERIOUS INTERNAL PROBLEMS WITH ITS AGRICULTURAL MINISTRY ON THIS ISSUE.

5. KOREA: MIYAZAWA STRESSED AT LENGTH HIS DESIRE TO

SMOOTH RELATIONS WITH KOREA AND FELT HE HAD MADE PROGRESS IN HIS RECENT MEETING WITH ROK FOREIGN MINISTER. HE EMPHASIZED HOWEVER, THAT KIM DAE JUNG CASE REMAINED SERIOUS DOMESTIC ISSUE NOT ONLY WITH JAPANESE PUBLIC BUT PRIME MINISTER MIKI AS WELL. HE SAID THAT TO SETTLE THISPROBLEM, IT WAS IMPORTANT ACCURACY OF JAPANESE POLICE CASE BEACKNOWLEDGED AND THAT KIM BE GIVEN FREEDOM TO TRAVEL EVEN BRIEFLY OUT OF KOREA, HABIB SAID MOST UNLIKELY EITHER OBJECTIVE COULD BE ACHIEVED. 6. ON QUESTION OF UNC, HABIB OUTLINED PRELIMINARY THINKING REGARDING HANDLING OFTHIS ISSUE AT NEXT UNGA. MIYAZAWA ASSURED US THAT "WHATEVER STRATEGY YOU WORK OUT WITH KUREANS, JAPAN WOULD COOPERATE." HABIBNOTED WE ALSO WISH TO WORK WITH JAPAN ON STRATEGY. 7. NPT8 MIYAZAWA REAFFIRMED GOJ INTENTION TO PRESENT TREATY TO DIET FOR RATIFICATION. HE EXPRESSED HOPE TO OBTAIN REAFFIRMATION OF US COMMITMENT UNDER SECURITY TREATY IN THIS REGARD. HE ALSO STATED JAPANWOULD WISH TO SUBMIT RESOLUTION AT FORTHCOMING REVIEW CONFERENCE REEMPHASIZING RESPONSIBILITIES OF NUCLEARPOWERS TOWARD

NONNUCLEAR STATES. US SIDE INDICATED RESOLUTION REAFFIRMING RESOLUTION 225 WOULD NOT CAUSEPROBLEMS, BUT

ATTEMPTED TO ADD PROTOCOL TO TREATY. MIYAZAWA SEEMED TO
UNDERSTAND US POINTS.

YASUKAWA STATED THAT GOJ HAD AID TO EGYPT UNDER MEETING. STUDY, BUT THAT CONFLICTING REPORTS OF EGYPTIAN NEEDS AND PORTION DESIRED FROM JAPAN MADE IT DIFFICULT FOR GOJ TO PROCEED. ORIGINAL FIGURE CITED BY USG HAD BEEN OVERALL PACKAGE OF S1 BILLION OF CURRENT IMPORT FINANCING WITH \$100 MILLION JAPANESE PORTION. SUBSEQUENTLY EGYPTIAN FOREIGN MINISTER FAHMY IN CONVERSATION REPORTED REF B. HAD SPOKEN OF \$3 BILLION WITH \$200 MILLION COMING FROM JAPAN. AMB. TOLD ROBINSON EMBASSY HAD JUST RECEIVED COPY OF CABLE REPORTING AMB. EILTS EXPLANATION TO JAPANESE AMBASSADOR IN CAIRO THAT GOE'S S3 BILLION INCLUDED \$1.5 BILLION TO REFINANCE EGYPT'S SHORT TERM DEBT. IN BOTH CONVERSATIONS YASUKAWA OFFERED AS PERSONAL RATHER THAN OFFICIAL VIEW SUGGESTION THAT WORLD BANK PLAY ROLE IN CLARIFYING EXACT NATURE OF EGYPT'S NEEDS AND GUIDELINES UNDER WHICH AID SHOULD BE PROVIDED. HE NOTED THAT IBRD PRESIDENT MCNAMARA HAD INFORMED HIM THAT USG HAD REQUESTED HIS ASSISTANCE AND THAT BANK STOOD READY TO HELP, IF GOE WERE TO MAKE RE-QUEST. YASUKAWA TOLD ROBINSON HE BELIEVED GOJ DECISION MIGHT BE ACCELERATED IF IBRD WERE TO COME UP WITH OVERALL PLAN.

3. SISCO STATED THAT US HAD DISCUSSED \$1.5 BILLION AID TOTAL WITH GOE WITH \$100 MILLION MENTIONED AS APPROPRIATE CONTRIBUTION FROM JAPAN. NATURALLY EGYPT WOULD LIKE TO OBTAIN \$200 MILLION FROM JAPAN, BUT USG HAD NOT TALKED ABOUT THIS AMOUNT. SISCO SAID USG CONSIDERED WORLD BANK INVOLVEMENT ESSENTIAL TO MONITOR EGYPT'S USE OF AID. HE EMPHASIZED THAT JAPAN AND US HAVE PARALLEL POLITICAL INTEREST IN HELPING EGYPT DEAL WITH HER PRESENT ECONOMIC DIFFICULTIES.

4. ROBINSON EXPLAINED THAT US HAD AGREED TO ASSIST GOE IN SOLICITING FINANCIAL SUPPORT. US ROLE WAS CONDITIONED ON GOE AGREEMENT THAT (A) IT WOULD NOT MAKE NET REPAYMENTS ON DEBTS TO MAJOR FOREIGN OFFICIAL CREDITORS AND (B) GOE WOULD CONSULT IBRD IN DEVELOPING MORE RATIONAL MANAGEMENT OF ITS FOREIGN EXCHANGE. IN ADDITION EGYPT WAS URGED TO CLARIFY RULES APPLYING TO FOREIGN PRIVATE INVESTMENT, INCLUDING APPLICABLE TAX AND FOREIGN EXCHANGE RATES.

TEAST S1.5 BILLION IN REFINANCING OF SHORT-TERM COMMERCIAL BANK DEBT (FOR WHICH IT IS SEEKING ARAB CASH LOANS) AND SOME FUNDS FOR EARLY 1976. USG BELIEVED THAT EGYPT SHOULD EXERCISE GREATER SELF-DISCIPLINE AND THAT S1 BILLION WAS ADEQUATE FOR BALANCE OF 1975, INCLUDING \$250 MILLION FROM US, MATCHED BY \$100 MILLION EACH FROM JAPAN AND FRG AND \$50 MILLION FROM FRANCE. GOE, HE SAID, COULD ACHIEVE SAVINGS BY SLOWING DOWN CAPITAL INVESTMENTS FOR WHICH PROJECT FUNDS ARE NOT CURRENTLY AVAILABLE, BY RESCHEDULING EXISTING BILATERAL DEBT TO EASTERN EUROPEY USSR AND BY ECONOMIZING ON IMPORTS OF CONSUMER GOODS.

ROBINSON SAID ROLE OF IBRD WAS TO PROVIDE ADVICE TO GOE ON MANAGING ITS FOREIGN EXCHANGE AND IN ESTABLISHING ITS ECONOMIC PRIORITIES, POATS DESCRIBED INDEPENDENT WORK OF IBRD TEAM NOW IN EGYPT AND NOTED THAT IBRD VICE PRESI-DENT FOR MIDDLE EAST WAS PREPARED TO RECOMMEND THAT BANK CONTINUE ITS LENDING PROGRAM AT PRESENT \$200 MILLION HOWEVER, IBRD HAD NEITHER BEEN ASKED NOR VOLUNTEERED TO BE CENTER OF CONSORTIUM FOR EGYPT. A ROLE WAS NOT DESIRED BY EGYPT, WHICH COUNTS OTHER ARAB COUNTRIES AS ITS LARGEST DONORS AND FOR DOMESTIC POLITICAL REASONS DOES NOT WANT AT THIS TIME TO GO THROUGH A BELT-TIGHTENING REGIME UNDER IBRD TUTELAGE. A CENTRAL COORDINATION ROLE FOR THE BANK IS ALSO NOT DESIRED BY THE OTHER ARAB COUNTRIES, ALTHOUGH SAUDI ARABIA, ALONG WITH IRAN, WISHES BANK TO CONTINUE TO ASSIST EGYPT IN MANAGE-MENT OF ITS ECONOMY. YASUKAWA ASKED IF, INSTEAD OF HEADING CONSORTIUM, IBRD MIGHT SIMPLY CALL A MEETING OF DONORS UNDER ITS AUSPICES. ROBINSON SAID HE WOULD NOT RULE OUT SUCH A MECHANISM AS MEANS OF EVALUATING AID PROGRAM FROM TIME TO TIME. POATS URGED YASUKAWA TO CON-TACT IBRD VICE PRESIDENT BENJENK FOR CORROBORATION OF US VIEWS REGARDING GOE NEEDS, BUT SUGGESTED THAT FOR PUBLIC RELATIONS REASONS GOE WOULD BE RELUCTANT TO HAVE IBRD CALL DONOR MEETING ANY TIME SOON. KISSINGER

SEVENTY MILLION DOLLAR LOAN FOR COMMODITY IMPORTS USING FY 75 AID FUNDS WAS SIGNED WITH GOE JUNE 29.
