Dear Mr. President,

I received with thanks your letter dated Oct. 19,1974, through which you wanted to assure me of your full backing of the strategy outlined in the course of my talks with Secretary Kissinger.

It is an added pleasure for me to note, in particular, that you feel "a special obligation to do everything feasible to help assure that the results achieved are commensurate with the risks involved". In this connection it is pertinet to expect that you will see to it, in the near future, that the growing relations between United States and Egypt will develop in such a manner that the obligations and commitments of both sides would be more publicly known and reflect more concrete and major decisions. This, I hope, you share with me. The necessity of following this course is so evident at this juncture in particular, and in the light of the recent visit of Foreign Minister Fahmy to Moscow. We are approaching a point where the leaders of the Soviet Union would like to play, at least once, the game intellegently.

Both the reception of the Foreign Minister and the immediate response of the General Secretary of the Central Committee, Brezhnev to hold a summit meeting in Cairo in January are indicative, in the sense that the Soviet leadership does not only want not to miss the bus for fear of the liquidation of their influence, but they apparently would like to frustrate, at the same time, any new developments in the U.S. Egyptian bilateral relations as well as any future moves towards a peaceful settlement of the Middle East crisis. This was crystal clear from the full and detailed report which Minister Fahmy submitted to me upon his return.



The attached letter from President Sadat to you was just received by cable.

It is obviously timed for the eve of Foreign Minister Allon's arrival in the United States. It is a significant letter and merits careful reading.

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Dear Mr. President:

As we are approaching the end of the year and Christmas is almost at the door I send you my greetings and that of Mrs. Sadat to Mrs. Ford and your family wishing you all the best of luck and a new year full of good hopes and additional successes to you in carrying out the heavy responsibilities of your high office. I am sure that you will, as you have already demonstrated, continue to work in a statesmanlike manner for international peace and security and the welfare of your people. This will be a landmark in the history of your country particularly if you will continue, God willing, in your office for a long time to come.

Seizing this occasion I felt that it may be opportune to continue our correspondence and exchange views on basic problems pertaining to our relations and to peace and tranquility in the Middle East. I am fully informed through your Secretary of State on basic problems related to the world at large and the next moves in the Middle East. I am sure, Mr. President, that Dr. Kissinger has briefed you as well on my views conveyed to him through his meetings with me when he was in the area or through his correspondence with Foreign Minister Fahmi.

I am pleased to see that our appraisal of the situation is almost identical and that we are fully aware of the various elements which have a direct or indirect impact on our strategy for the immediate future.

So far as I am concerned, my constant preoccupation is to do my best to lessen the tension in the area or, if I may say so, to defuse the timebomb, in order to be able to work assiduously for further progress on the path to peace and welfare for the peoples in the area.

In this connection I take it that the Egyptian position is crystal clear so far as the next step is concerned. I am sure that you share with me that the next step must be a move of a substantial character and commensurate with all the risks involved and at the same time be finalized and signed within the coming 4 weeks or so. I have explained with all candor my position to Dr. Kissinger as well as the limits of the solution which I am prepared to accept. I equally explained to him the various elements involved which have certainly something to do with the coming visits by the Heads of States to Cairo and the situation in the Arab world.

Consequently as the Egyptian position is abundantly clear to you and your Secretary of State and as the time factor in this case is of paramount importance I hope that you agree with me that [it] is necessary to seize this momentum and work hard to achieve concrete progress. As I have said before, it is my hope that you will use your influence

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so that the next move be signed with the comming (sic) few weeks knowing that its implementation may take a longer time.

I have no doubt that with your support of this view and with your full backing of this line, which your very able Secretary of State is fully aware of, it is possible to achieve net results without loosing (sic) unnecessary time and effort engaging or an endless exercise of examining unacceptable and not serious proposals from the other side, while our situation and the situation of the Israelis are both well know to you.

Having said that I am fully convinced that with your support and backing and with statesmanship and vision we will be able to move ahead without complicating things and without letting ourselves become engaged in a sterile debate on minor side issues.

It is, therefore, necessary to have a real appraisal of all these factors and the momentum and the issues which are at stake.

In concluding, Mr. President, I am sure that with your determination and conviction to work for peace and tranquility you will see to it that it becomes possible to achieve without any hesitation real progress.

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TWO THINGS STAND OUT IN MY MIND AS I LOOK BACK OVER THAT PERIOD.

FIRST, THIS HAS CLEARLY BEEN ONE OF THOSE TIMES IN HISTORY

WHEN HISTORIC CHANGES OCCUR IN THE COURSE OF INTERNA-TIONAL RELATIONSHIPS. A SIGNIFICANT PART OF THAT HAS BEEN THE SHIFT IN THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES AND THE LEADING ARAB NATIONS.

SECOND, IT IS CLEAR THAT YOUR OWN VISION OF WHAT COULD BE ACCOMPLISHED BY A CLOSE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES AND EGYPT HAS PLAYED A CENTRAL HOLE IN THAT EVOLUTION. THE DISCUSSIONS BETWEEN YOU AND SECRETARY KISSINGER QUICKLY TURNED TO THE QUESTION OF WHAT COULD BE ACCOMPLISHED IF THE UNITED STATES AND EGYPT COULD MOVE ACCORDING TO A COMMON STRATEGIC CONCEPT. THE SPECIFIC STEPS THAT HAVE BEEN TAKEN DURING THIS PERIOD HAVE REFLECTED THAT COMMON APPROACH.

FOR A VARIETY OF REASONS, WE HAVE NOT BEEN ABLE TO MOVE AS QUICKLY AS EITHER OF US WOULD HAVE LIKED IN THE PAST FIVE MONTHS. THIS HAS NOT BEEN BECAUSE OF ANY CHANGE IN OUR PERCEPTION OF DUR COMMON OBJECTIVES. IT HAS RESULTED FROM CIRCUMSTANCES NOT ENTIRELY WITHIN THE CONTROL OF EITHER OF US. AFTER A CERTAIN POINT, THE DELAY HAS INCREASED THE DIFFICULTY OF MOVING AHEAD.

NOW I BELIEVE WE AGAIN HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO MOVE AHEAD PROMPTLY, AND WE ARE DETERMINED TO MOVE AS RAPIDLY AND AS FAR AS POSSIBLE. I AM FULLY MINDFUL OF HOW IMPORTANT IT IS FOR YOU -- BUT ALSO FOR US -- THAT THE STEP-BY-STEP STRATEGY OUR TWO GOVERNMENTS CHARTED TOGETHER BE SEEN TO HAVE CONCRETE AND POSITIVE RESULTS. I AM ALSO MINDFUL OF THE RISKS AND DIFFICULTIES THIS STRATEGY ENTAILS FOR YOU. I REMAIN PERSUADED, HOWEVER, THAT ANY OTHER COURSE INVOLVES EVEN GREATER DANGERS AND HOLDS OUT MUCH LESS HOPE OF ULTIMATELY ACHIEVING THE PEACE WE BOTH SEEK. FOR EXAMPLE, TO RECONVENT THE GENEVA CONFERENCE AT THIS TIME NOULD PRODUCE A STALEMATE SECRET

AND ONLY TRANSFER TO THAT MULTILATERAL FORUM SOME OF THE DIFFICULTIES WE NOW SEE DEVELOPING.

I THEREFORE BELIEVE THAT WE MUST PROCEED CALMLY AT THIS TIME. ONE REALITY WE MUST FACE IS THAT THE GOVERNMENT OF ISRAEL, TO PROTECT ITS OWN DOMESTIC POSITION, CANNOT AGREE TO WITHDRAW WITHOUT SOME RECIPROCAL UNDERTAKINGS ON THE PART OF EGYPT. NE UNDERSTANU, MR. Dear Mr. President:

At this particular juncture I felt it may be opportune to share with you certain thoughts with respect to the present stage of contacts which are carried on with my admiration and confidence by your Secretary of State.

I am sure that Dr. Kissinger is putting you fully in the picture so far as the present contacts in the area. However, you may agree with me that the situation reached almost a deadlock as a result of the Israelis' continued intransigence, insisting that we give them in return for a very limited disengagement agreement; a statement lifting belligerency or agreeing to a formula under which all the implications of a real and final peace would ensue.

I hope you agree with me that it is impossible to continue the present contacts on that basis in the light of the persistence of the Israelis to get concessions which could not be given under any pretext except when we reach the final state of a just and durable peace, which, obviously, must include all the parties concerned and all the essentials of peace.

From your messages, I had the distinct impression that you are also aware of the position of the parties and that on that basis, you have instructed your Secretary of State to come to our area to continue with his usual dedication to the cause of peace, to try to bring the parties to agree on a further step after long and arduous efforts to prepare for

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his trip to attain these goals.

Most unfortunately, as you must have known from your Secretary of State, we have almost reached a deadlock because of the intransigence of the Israelis, which is completely out of proportion so far as the limited goal of the present exercise. And because of the Israeli position, it is abundantly clear that such an attitude on their part is completely unacceptable to us.

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I am sure, Mr. President, that with your wisdom and your vigor, you will take the appropriate measures which would enable your Secretary of State to succeed in his tireless efforts.

In conclusion, I would like to assure you that, irrespective of the results of the present mission of Dr. Kissinger, it is my intention to continue to develop our relations. The purpose of my message is to draw attention to the serious repercussions on the chances of peace and tranquillity in the area and on international peace and security in general if the Israeli Government continues to follow such a defiant position, and, as such, they bear the full responsibility if the situation deteriorates because of the line they are adhering to.

THE EGYPTIAN COUNTER-PROPOSAL AS REPORTED CAIRO'S 6274 (CHEROKEE) FAHMY HANDED HE A MESSAGE FROM PRESIDENT SADAT TO PRESIDENT FORD TO BE DELIVERED THROUGH YOU. HE WAS PARTICULARLY CONCERNED THAT THE LETTER NOT RECEIVE ANY CIRCULATION AND THEREFORE SPECIFICALLY ASKED THAT IT BE SENT THROUGH THIS CHANNEL. TEXT OF LETTER FOLLOWS:

KISSINGER'S TIRELESS EFFORTS IN MARCH WITH A VIEW TO BRING ABOUT FURTHER PROGRESS.

3. I HOPE YOU AGREE WITH ME THAT, JUDGING FROM THE LATEST VERSION OF THE ISRAELI PROPOSALS, IT IS ABUNDANTLY CLEAR, AS I HAVE TOLD YOU IN SALZBURG, THAT THE ISRAELIS ARE NEITHER WILLING NOR CAPABLE, FOR ONE REASON OR ANOTHER, TO MOVE ALONG THE LONG AND ARDUOUS ROAD TO PEACE. 

S. FAILING TO DO THIS, THE ISRAELIS BEAR ALL THE CONSEQUENCES OF THEIR ADAMANCE. AMBASSADOR EILTS HAS CONVEYED YOUR PRIVATE LETTER TO ME, AND I WANT TO RESPOND IN THE SAME SPIRIT OF PERSONAL TRUST AND COMPLETE CANDOR.

YOU KNOW FROM THE AMBASSADOR OF MY DISAPPOINTMENT WITH THE ISRAELI POSITION, WHICH I NEVERTHELESS FELT WE HAD TO RELAY TO YOU IN ORDER TO GIVE YOU THE OPPORTUNITY TO FORM YOUR OWN JUDGMENT.

AFTER REVIEWING CAREFULLY THE CONTERPROPOSAL WHICH DEPUTY PRIME MINISTERS FAHMY AND GAMASY OUTLINED ON YOUR BEHALF TO AMBASSADOR EILTS, I HAVE COME TO THE JUDGMENT THAT THE BEST WAY TO PROCEED IS AS FOLLOWS,

I BELIEVE THAT TO PASS YOUR PROPOSAL FORMALLY TO ISRAEL AT THIS TIME WOULD IN ALL PROBABILITY LEAD TO A TERM MINATION OF NEGOTIATIONS. AS A NEXT STEP, I AM THEREFORE SENDING A FORMAL MESSAGE TO PRIME MINISTER RABIN REQUESTING ISRAEL TO RECONSIDER ITS POSITION. I WILL INFORM YOU AS SOON AS I HAVE RECEIVED ISRAEL'S REPLY, AND WE CAN THEN DETERMINE TOGETHER HOW BEST TO PROCEED.

FOR AMBASSADOR EILTS FROM SECRETARY KISSINGER

PLEASE DELIVER FOLLOWING MESSAGE FROM PRESIDENT FORD TO 1 . PRESIDENT SADAT VIA FAHMY.

BEGIN MESSAGE: DEAR MR. PRESIDENT: THANK YOU FOR YOUR LETTER OF AUGUST 14, REAFFIRMING YOUR COMMITMENT TO THE OB-JECTIVE WE SHARE OF ACHIEVING A CUMPREHENSIVE, JUST AND DURABLE PEACE IN THE MIDDLE EAST.

I FULLY UNDERSTAND AND AGREE WITH YOUR VIEW THAT THE AGREEMENT CURRENTLY UNDER NEGOTIATION, IMPORTANT AS IT IS FOR REDUCING TENSIONS AND RECAPTURING THE MOMENTUM TOWARD PEACE, CONSTITUTES ONLY A STEP TOWARD A FINAL SETTLEMENT. I RECOGNIZE THAT YOUR PREFERENCE HOULD HAVE BEEN TO PRO-SECRET



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CEED NOW TO A FINAL SETTLEMENT. I ALSO RECOGNIZE THAT THE SITUATION FOLLOWING ISRAELI WITHDRAWAL FROM THE PASSES AND THE UIL FIELDS WILL NOT BE AN ACCEPTABLE PER-MANENT SOLUTION TO YOU OR TO THE ARAB WORLD GENERALLY. WE DISCUSSED FRANKLY AT SALZBURG WHY AN INTERIM STEP IS THE BEST WAY TO PROCEED AT THIS TIME WHILE PERMITTING THE

REALITIES IN THE AREA AND INTERNATIONALLY TO MATURE TO THE POINT WHERE AN ALL-OUT EFFORT TO ACHIEVE FINAL PEACE CAN BE MADE. IN THOSE DISCUSSIONS, WE BOTH AGREED THAT THE ISSUES OF A COMPREHENSIVE SETTLEMENT MUST BE ADDRESSED WHEN CIRCUMSTANCES SEEM MOST PROMISING FOR SUCCESS. AS I SAID TO YOU, THE UNITED STATES WILL CONTINUE TO PLAY A VITAL ROLE IN THE PEACEMAKING PROCESS AND WILL DO ITS UTMOST TO MOVE MATTERS FORWARD EXPEDITIOUSLY. WHILE RECOGNIZING THAT A FINAL PEACE AGREEMENT IS IMPORTANTLY A MATTER TO BE NEGOTIATED BY THE PARTIES, THE UNITED STATES WILL BE PREPARED TO PUT FORWARD IDEAS OF OUR OWN WHEN AND IF IT BECOMES NECESSARY TO DO SO.

I AM CERTAIN, MR. PRESIDENT, THAT THE COURSE ON WHICH WE ARE EMBARKED IS THE RIGHT ONE AND THAT, PENDING A FINAL SETTLEMENT, THE AGREEMENT NOW BEING NEGOTIATED WILL BRING MAJOR BENEFITS TO EGYPT. SECRETARY KISSINGER WILL COME TO THE MIDDLE EAST THIS WEEK WITH MY FULL SUPPORT AND DETERMINATION TO ACHIEVE THE STEP IMMEDIATELY AHEAD OF US. AS WE ENTER THIS FINAL STAGE OF THE CURRENT NEGOTIATIONS, I HOPE YOU WILL CONTINUE TO SUPPORT DR. KISSINGER'S EFFORTS WITH THE VISION YOU HAVE ALWAYS SHOWN AND WITH YOUR STATES= MANLIKE ABILITY TO KEEP YOUR EYE ON THE MAIN ISSUES WITHOUT BEING DIVERTED BY PERIPHERAL MATTERS. THESE QUALITIES OF YOURS HAVE BEEN DECISIVE IN BRINGING MEASURABLE PROGRESS FOR THE FIRST TIME TUWARD THE PEACE THAT HAS ELUDED ALL PREVIOUS LEADERS IN THE AREA.

DR. KISSINGER WILL CONVEY TO YOU PERSONALLY MY STRONG CON-VICTION THAT, ONCE THIS IMMEDIATE STEP IS ACCOMPLISHED, WE MUST REMAIN FIRM IN PURSUIT OF OUR CUMMON STRATEGY OVER THE MONTHS AHEAD UNTIL THE TIME IS RIPE TO DEVOTE OUR FULL ATTENTION AND ENERGY TO DOING WHAT IS NECESSARY TO BRING ABOUT A FINAL PEACE SETTLEMENT. THE UNITED STATES FOR ITS SECRET



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PART WILL FULFILL ITS RESPONSIBILITIES IN THIS RESPECT.

FINALLY, MR. PRESIDENT, ONCE THE INTERIM AGREEMENT WE ARE DISCUSSING HAS BEEN ACHIEVED, IT IS MY STRONG HOPE AND DESIRE THAT YOU AND MRS.SADAT WILL PAY A VISIT TO OUR COUNTRY THIS YEAR AS MRS. FORD'S AND MY GUESTS.

SINCE FAHMY IS IN ALEXANDRIA, I DELIVERED REFERENCE MESSAGE TODAY TO MINSTATE FOR FOREIGN AFFAIRS MOHAMED RIAD WITH REQUEST IT BE FORWARDED IMMEDIATELY TO PRESIDENT SADAT THROUGH FAHMY. RIAD AT ONCE DISPATCHED THE LETTER BY SPECIAL MESSENGER. FAHMY SHOULD HAVE IT LATE THIS AFTERNOON AND WILL FORWARD IT IMMEDIATELY TO PRESIDENT SADAT AT BORG AL-ARAB. EILTS

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HISTORIC ACHIEVEMENT. IT IS A DECISION YOU TOOK IN ORDER TO ADVANCE TOWARD A JUST AND LASTING PEACE IN THE MIDDLE EAST NOT ONLY, AS YOU SAID TO ME, FOR YOUR COUNTRY BUT FOR THE ENTIRE AREA. NOW THAT THIS AGREEMENT HAS BEEN CONCLUDED I

WANT TO SHARE WITH YOU MY VIEWS OF THE CURRENT SITUATION AND OF PROSPECTS FOR THE FUTURE.

THE AGREEMENT JUST CONCLUDED HAS BROUGHT TANGIBLE BENEFITS TO EGYPT. NOT ONLY WILL YOU RECOVER THE USE OF YOUR NATION'S OIL RESOURCES IN THE SINAI, BUT YOU HAVE ALSO BROUGHT ABOUT ISRAEL'S WITHDRAWAL FROM THE STRATEGIC SINAI PASSES, TO HAVE FOREGONE THESE GAINS IN ORDER TO PURSUE, WITHOUT LAYING ANY GROUNDWORK, AN ALL-OR-NOTHING NEGOTIATION AT GENEVA WOULD IN MY JUDGMENT HAVE ASSURED STALEMATE AND A RAPID DETERIORATION OF THE SITUATION TO THE THE RENEFIT OF NO ONE COUNTRY. IT WAS THIS REALITY WHICH LED US, AS IT DID YOU, TO CONCLUDE THAT A FURTHER INTERIM AGREEMENT WAS THE ONLY WAY TO MAKE EARLY PRACTICAL PROGRESS. IN SEIZING THIS OPPORTUNITY, YOU HAVE MADE POSSIBLE WHAT COULD BECOME, IN YOUR OWN WORDS, A TURNING POINT TOWARD PEACE WITH JUSTICE NOT ONLY FOR EGYPT BUT ALSO FOR THE ENTIRE ARAB WORLD TO WHICH EGYPT HAS SO LONG GIVEN LEADERSHIP. THESE REALITIES WILL SURVIVE LONG AFTER THE CRITICISM EMANATING FROM SOME QUARTERS HAS BEEN FOR-GOTTEN.

HERE IN THE UNITED STATES I BELIEVE THINGS ARE GOING

WELL. THE CONGRESS IS SHOWING A SYMPATHETIC UNDERSTANDING OF THE AGREEMENT AND OF THE RESPONSIBILITIES WHICH THE UNITED STATES HAS UNDERTAKEN IN CONNECTION WITH IT. I BELIEVE THAT THE CONGRESS WILL SHORTLY GIVE ITS APPROVAL TO THE U.S. PROPOSAL TO ENTRUST TO AMERICAN CIVILIAN TECHNICIANS THE EARLY WARNING SYSTEM IN THE SINAI PASSES, TO SERVE AS YOU SO APTLY PUT IT, AS WITNESSES TO THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PEACE AGREEMENT. THE CONGRESS ALSO APPEARS FAVORABLY DISPOSED TOWARD PROVIDING THE ECONOMIC ASSISTANCE TO EGYPT WHICH WE DISCUSSED IN SALZBURG AND WHICH SECRETARY KISSINGER FURTHER DISCUSSED WITH YOU IN ALEXANDRIA. I PLAN TO SUBMIT A REQUEST TO THE CONGRESS



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FOR DOLS 700 MILLION IN ECONOMIC ASSISTANCE FOR EGYPT.

WE HAVE ALSO BEEN IN TOUCH WITH A NUMBER OF OTHER GOVERN-MENTS TO EMPHASIZE HOW IMPORTANT THIS AGREEMENT IS AS A STEP TOWARD & JUST AND LASTING PEACE, WE HAVE ENCOURAGED THEM TO GIVE BROAD SUPPORT TO YOU. DESPITE THE PREDICTABLE CRITICISMS WHICH HAVE COME FROM CERTAIN COUNTRIES, I AM CONVINCED THAT HISTORY WILL SHOW THAT YOU ARE THE ONLY ARAB LEADER WHO HAS MADE TANGIBLE PROGRESS TOWARD A JUST PEACE. THE WORLD WILL COME TO UNDERSTAND THAT YOU MADE YOUR HISTORIC DECISION NOT JUST FOR EGYPT BUT FOR ALL ARABS. WE WILL CONTINUE TO MAKE THESE POINTS WITH OTHER GOVERNMENTS AND TO URGE THEM TO TAKE CONCRETE ACTIONS TO DEMONSTRATE THEIR SUPPORT OF YOUR

POLICIES.

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I HAVE NOTED THE PUBLIC EXPRESSIONS OF CONCERN COMING FROM THE MIDDLE EAST THAT THE AGREEMENT NOT FREEZE THE SITUATION DIPLOMATICALLY. I SHARE THIS VIEW. WITH PARTICULAR REFERENCE TO SYRIA, SECRETARY KISSINGER HAS TOLD PRESIDENT ASAD THAT WE WOULD MAKE A SERIOUS EFFORT TO HELP ACHIEVE PROGRESS ON THE SYRIAN FRONT, AND HE HAS ASSURED PRESIDENT ASAD THAT THE UNITED STATES COUNTS ON A UNITED ARAB WURLD TO FURTHER THE PEACE PROCESS. IN OUR VIEW. DIVISION IN THE ARAB WORLD IS THE DANGER TO FUTURE PROGRESS, AS I HAVE SAID ON NUMEROUS OCCASIONS, WE ARE COMMITTED TO THE PROPOSITION THAT A LASTING PEACE IN THE MIDDLE EAST MUST INVOLVE PROGRESS ON ALL FRONTS AND MUST BE BASED ON CAREFUL ATTENTION TO THE INTERESTS OF ALL ITS PEOPLE, INCLUDING THE PALESTINIANS.

WITH REGARD TO THE SOVIET UNION I WANT YOU TO KNOW THAT WE HAVE TAKEN A VERY FIRM LINE WITH GENERAL SECRETARY BREZHNEY. THE SOVIET RESPONSE, WHILE COMPLAINING OVER THE LACK OF INVOLVEMENT IN THE NEGOTIATIONS, INDICATES THAT THEY DO NOT INTEND TO PLAY AN OBSTRUCTIONIST ROLE. I HAVE REASON TO BELIEVE, BASED ON A COMMUNICATION WE RECEIVED WITHIN THE LAST TWENTY-FOUR HOURS FROM THE SOVIETS, THAT THEY WILL NOT MAKE MAJOR DIFFICULTIES. SECRETARY KISSINGER WILL BE MEETING FOREIGN MINISTER SECRET

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GROMYKO NEXT WEEK TO DISCUSS THE SITUATION, AND WE WILL KEEP YOU CURRENTLY INFORMED, AS WE HAVE THROUGHOUT, OF THESE EXCHANGES.

AN ADDITIONAL REASON FOR MY HIGH SFNSE OF GRATIFICATION AT THE SUCCESSFUL CONCLUSION OF THIS AGREEMENT IS THE PROSPECT THAT IT WILL NOW BE POSSIBLE FOR YOU AND MRS. SADAT TO VISIT THE UNITED STATES. YOUR VISIT IS ONE THAT MRS. FORD AND I HAVE LONG LOOKED FORWARD TO WITH GREAT PLEASURE. I WANT THE AMERICAN PEOPLE TO GET TO KNOW YOU AS I DO. I AM CONFIDENT THAT SUCH A VISIT WILL REINFORCE BOTH OUR OFFICIAL AND PERSONAL TIES AND REINFORCE OUR MUTUAL EFFORTS TO ACHIEVE PEACE IN THE MIDDLE EAST. I HOPE YOU WILL PLAN ON BOTH A STATE VISIT TO WASHINGTON AS WELL AS ALLOW TIME TO TRAVEL TO OTHER PARTS OF AMERICA. I WOULD LIKE TO SUGGEST THAT YOU PLAN YOUR VISIT STARTING OCTOBER 28.

SUBJECT: MESSAGE FOR PRESTDENT SADAT

FOR AMBASSADOR FROM THE SECRETARY

PLEASE PASS THE FOLLOWING MESSAGE TO PRESIDENT SADAT THROUGH FAHMI.

DEAR MR. PRESIDENT: 2.

YESTERDAY I SENT A VERY BRIEF PRELIMINARY ORAL REPORT TO ISMAIL ON OUR TALKS WITH MR, GROMYKO HERE IN WASHINGTON ON THE QUESTION OF THE MIDDLE EAST. THUS FAR WE HAD ONLY TOUCHED UPON THE SUBJECT LIGHTLY, LAST NIGHT I HAD A FULLER DISCUSSION WITH HIM, AND I AGREED TO HAVING A FURTHER EXCHANGE WITH HIM AT OUR FINAL MEETING WHICH WILL TAKE PLACE SUNDAY NIGHT.

AS I REPORTED TO ISMAIL, GROMYKO HAS BEEN MODERATE IN HIS ATTITUDE, ALMOST PLAINTIVE IN HIS EXPRESSIONS OF SOVIET SECRET

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DESIRE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PEACE PROCESS OF THE MIDDLE EAST. HE MADE CLEAR THAT THE SOVIET UNION OBJECTS TO WHAT HE HAS CHARACTERIZED THE SEPARATE AMERICAN EFFORT WHICH HAS

RESULTED IN THE EGYPTIAN-ISRAELI AGREEMENT. HOWEVER, BEARING IN MIND THAT IN MY EARLIER MEETING I HAD WARNED HIM FIRMLY AGAINST ANY UNTOWARD INTERFERENCE IN THE DN-GOING PROCESS OR THE AGREEMENT ITSELF AND THAT SUCH INTERFERENCE COULD AFFECT OUR OVERALL RELATIONS, I NOTED IN PARTICULAR AT LAST NIGHT'S MEETING HIS INDICATION THAT THE SOVIETS DO NOT INTEND TO OBSTRUCT WHAT HAS BEEN ACHIEVED BETWEEN EGYPT AND ISRAEL,

WHILE THE DISCUSSION LAST NIGHT ON THE MIDDLE EAST WAS EXTENSIVE, IT WAS, AS YOU MIGHT EXPECT, A VERY INCON-CLUSIVE ONE. GROMYKO HAD NO SPECIFIC IDEAS AS TO HOW WE MIGHT PROCEED. HIS DUAL EMPHASIS WAS THAT THEY HAD BEEN LEFT OUT OF THE PEACE PROCESS AND THEY WISH TO QUOTE ACT JOINTLY UNQUOTE WITH THE US ON THE MIDDLE EAST. HE HAS NO CLEAR IDEA HOW TO DO THIS. HE SAID THAT NEITHER SYRIA NOR THE PLO ARE INTERESTED IN GOING TO A GENEVA CONFERENCE AT THIS TIME AND THAT THE SOVIETS THEREFORE WOULD NOT ATTEND A GENEVA CONFERENCE. HE SAID THAT THIS VIEW WAS BASED ON GUOTE CONTACTS WITH SYRIA UNGUOTE AND HE INSISTED ON PLO PARTICIPATION AT THE OUTSET.

MR. PRESIDENT, I EXPLAINED THE AMERICAN POSITION TO HIM IN TERMS WHICH WILL BE VERY FAMILIAR TO YOU. I TOLD HIM THAT WE HAD INFORMED THE SYRIANS, ISRAELIS, EGYPT AND OTHER ARAB STATES THAT THE US IS PREPARED TO UNDERTAKE A SERIOUS EFFORT TO GET NEGOTIATIONS STARTED BETWEEN SYRIA AND ISRAEL, EITHER IN A BILATERAL OR MULTILATERAL SETTING. I TOLD HIM THAT WE DO NOT SEE THE EGYPTIAN-ISRAEL AGREEMENT AS AN END IN ITSELF BUT AS A STEP TOWARDS AN OVERALL SETTLEMENT, AND THAT I WAS CONFIDENT THAT IT WAS NEITHER OUR DESIRE NOR YOURS TO STAND STILL AND TO DIVIDE THE ARAB WORLD. I SAID THAT WE ARE PRE-PARED TO WORK THROUGH DIPLOMATIC CHANNELS, CONSIDER THE RECONVENING OF THE GENEVA CONFERENCE, OR CONSIDER A MIX OF SUCH CONSULTATIONS, IALSO STRESSED CANDIDLY



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THAT UNDER PRESENT CONDITIONS INSISTENCE ON PLO PAR-TICIPATION AT THE OUTSET WOULD LIKELY KILL THE CON-FERENCE OR PRECLUDE ITS CONVENING. I SAID THAT WE WERE PREPARED TO CONSIDER WAYS TO HAVE THE CONFERENCE CON-VENE IF THIS WAS THE DESIRE OF THE STATES CONCERNED, AND THAT WAYS MIGHT BE EXPLORED FOR PALESTINIAN PAR-TICIPATION AT SUCH A CONFERENCE AT SOME LATER PHASE. FINALLY, I ALSO SAID THAT WE WERE WILLING TO MAINTAIN CONTACT WITH THE SOVIETS AND CONTINUE OUR FURTHER EX-CHANGES OF VIEWS.

MR PRESIDENT, THESE ARE THE ESSENTIAL FACTS, NOW I WANT TO GIVE YOU MY JUDGMENT ON THE SOVIET POSITION. THEY SEEM CONFUSED WITH RESPECT TO THE MIDDLE EAST AND HAVE NO CLEAR CUT STRATEGY. THE CONCERTED STRATEGY OF EGYPT AND THE US TOGETHER HAS THROWN THEM OFF BALANCE. GROMYKO WANTS THE SOVIETS IN ON THE PROCESS OF PEACE. BUT HE HAS NO CLEAR CUT IDEAS ON HOW THIS CAN BE DONE. I DETECTED CONTINUING CONCERN ON HIS PART THAT SYRIA -MIGHT INDICATE TO US A WILLINGNESS TO PROCEED TO NEGOTIATIONS WITH ISRAEL UNDER US AEGIS, AS WE HAVE DONE ON THE EGYPTIAN-ISRAEL AGREEMENT, AND THAT THIS WOULD LEAVE THE SOVIETS OUT, I HAVE THE IMPRESSION ALSO HE HAS ACTUALLY BEEN DISCOURAGING THE SYRIANS FROM EITHER GOING TO GENEVA OR OF GIVING POSITIVE IN-DICATIONS TO US ON NEGOTIATIONS WITH SYRIA UNDER US AUSPICES. THIS IS ONLY AN IMPRESSION, AND I WOULD DEEPLY APPRECIATE YOUR JUDGMENT IN THIS REGARD. IN ORDER TO AVOID ANY MISUNDERSTANDING WITH ASSAD I WANT YOU TO KNOW THAT I INTEND TO REPORT TO HIM DIRECTLY --THOUGH IN A MUCH MORE ABBREVIATED FORM == JUST WHAT GROMYKO HAS SAID TO US AND WHAT OUR POSITION IS IN THIS REGARD.

I KNOW, MR PRESIDENT, THAT WE AND YOU HAVE GONE THROUGH A DIFFICULT PERIOD IN THE LAST TWO WEEKS SINCE THE ACHIEVEMENT OF THE AGREEMENT, I HAVE ADMIRED FROM AFAR HOW MAGNIFICENTLY YOU HAVE HANDLED THE VERBAL ATTACKS THAT HAVE COME FROM CERTAIN QUARTERS IN THE ARAB WORLD -- ATTACKS WHICH IN PART HAVE BEEN ENCOURAGED BY THE SOVIET UNION', BUT I AM ENCOURAGED, AND I HOPE YOU ARE,



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THAT THE WORKING GROUP IN GENEVA SEEMS TO BE CONCLUD-ING ITS DELIBERATIONS SUCCESSFULLY, AND I WOULD LIKE TO BELIEVE THAT OUR TIMELY INTERVENTION A FEW DAYS AGO HAS HAD A CONSTRUCTIVE IMPACT ON THE ISRAELI POSITION.

FOR THE FIRST TIME, PARTICULARLY IN THE CONTEXT OF MY TALKS WITH PERES HERE, I GET THE FEELING THAT THE ISRAELIS ARE BEGINNING TO UNDERSTAND THAT IF THEY CAN SHOW SOME GREATER UNDERSTANDING OF THE POLITICAL AND PSYCHOLOGICAL CURRENTS IN THE ARAB WORLD, OF YOUR POSI= TION IN THE AREA, OF THE WISE AND COURAGEOUS WAY IN WHICH YOU ARE LEADING BOTH EGYPT AND THE ARABS TOWARDS MODERATION AND PEACEFUL PURSUITS--THAT INDEED THE RECENT AGREEMENT MAY VERY WELL BE THE TURNING POINT WHICH YOU AND WE HAVE WANTED. WE ARE BOTH REALISTIC, MR PRESIDENT, WE KNOW THIS WILL TAKE TIME AND THE PACE OF NEGOTIATIONS, PARTICULARLY AS IT RELATES TO THE

SYRIAN-ISRAELI ASPECT OF THE PROBLEM, WILL TAKE TIME. BUT I AM MORE CONVINCED TODAY MORE THAN EVER THAT WE ARE ON THE RIGHT COURSE AND THAT MOVING TOGETHER WE CAN ACHIEVE DUR COMMON GOALS.

JUST A WORD ON THE PERES VISIT. FRANKLY, IT WAS A BETTER VISIT THAN I HAD REASON TO EXPECT. THE REASON I SAY THIS IS THAT PERES SEEMS TO BE MOVING IN THE DIRECTION OF TRYING TO GET ISRAEL TO ADOPT A REASON-ABLE POSITION ON THE IDEA OF NEGOTIATIONS BETWEEN SYRIA AND ISRAEL. HE SAID PUBLICLY AFTER MY MEETING THAT ISRAEL IS READY FOR NEGOTIATIONS WITH SYRIA WITHOUT PRECONDITIONS.

INSOFAR AS THE ONGOING MILITARY ASSISTANCE RELATION SHIP BETWEEN ISRAEL AND THE U.S., HERE ARE MAIN FACTS. DURING THE REASSESSMENT, WE HELD UP, AS YOU KNOW, ON SOME ITEMS.

WE HAVE LIFTED THE BAN ON THESE. MOREOVER, THERE WAS A LIST, LONG IN EXISTENCE, OF SOME OTHER ITEMS OF A LESS SIGNIFICANT CHARACTER WHICH WE WILL NOW RELEASE AS PART OF THE NORMAL ONGOING MILITARY ASSISTANCE RE-LATIONSHIP, AS TO OTHER ITEMS WHICH ISRAEL IS INTERESTED

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IN, SUCH AS THE PERSHING MISSILES, THESE REMAIN IN THE STUDY CATEGORY AND NO COMMITMENTS HAVE BEEN MADE.

FINALLY, MR PRESIDENT, I WANT TO TELL YOU HOW MUCH PRESIDENT FORD LOOKS FORWARD TO YOUR VISIT. WE HAVE BEGUN IN EARNEST THE PREPARATIONS WITH A VIEW TO ASSUR-ING THAT IT WILL BE FRUITFUL AND PRODUCTIVE FOR BOTH OF US. I AM ANXIOUS THAT THE AMERICAN PEOPLE COME TO KNOW YOU AS WE DO AS A STATESMAN OF GREAT COURAGE AND VISION, AND I HOPE THAT YOU WILL GET A FEEL OF THE PULSE OF THE AMERICAN PEOPLE WHO SUPPORT STRONGLY THE ADMIN-ISTRATION'S PRESENT POLICY IN THE MIDDLE EAST WHICH NOW IS NO LONGER ONE SIDED BUT SEEKS TO PROTECT THE OVERALL NATIONAL INTERESTS OF THE US IN THE AREA -- A POLICY THAT RETAINS THE SPECIAL RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN ISRAEL AND THE U'S', BUT IS EQUALLY DETERMINED TO STRENGTHEN THE BOND OF FRIENDSHIP BETWEEN AMERICA AND

THE ARAB WORLD'. IN ALL OF THIS YOU ARE IN INDISPENSABLE KEY. WARMEST REGARDS'. KISSINGER
