WEEKLY REPORT #16, Week Ending October 25, 1975

I. STATE CAMPAIGN ORGANIZATION

Four PFC State Chairmen were appointed last week for a current total of 21 states with top campaign leadership, including each of the first five primary states. A list of the State Chairmen is attached at Tab A.

- 1. Massachusetts Silvio Conte has agreed to be State PFC Chairman and his announcement will come at a Boston press conference. David Sparks, a highly recommended young Middlesex County official, has been hired as the State Campaign Manager to work under Conte.
- 2. Rhode Island Because of the fluid political situation brought about by John Pastore's retirement, the appointment of a PFC State Chairman is pending the Party leadership's selection of a Senatorial candidate. National Committee Members Jim Field, Jr., Fred Lippitt and June Gibbs have all agreed to serve as active co-chairmen during this interim period.
- 3. Ohio Columbus attorney and former 1972 State CRP official Keith McNamara has accepted the PFC State Chairman's position. Governor Rhodes' strong personal choice, McNamara last week received Washington staff briefings and had his initial campaign budget approved.
- 4. Wyoming Deimer True of the Casper-based True Oil Company accepted the position of State PFC Chairman, and Bob Flanigan is working with True on the campaign's state organization.
- 5. Florida Bill Young has moved aggressively on his own in putting together a PFC organization in Pinellas County using his base of campaign supporters. The County contributes about 20% of the total primary vote and is expected to be a prime Reagan organizational target. I will be visiting Pinellas County later this week.

6. <u>Delaware</u> - Lt. Gov. Gene Bookhammer declined to accept the PFC Chairmanship saying he would be running for office in Delaware. He pledged his personal support to your campaign and offered to help in any other way.

II. FINANCE

Approximately \$48,657 was received last week for a total to date of \$900,111.85. Twenty-one states and \$375,082 are qualifiable for matching funds. A copy of the Treasurer's Report is provided at Tab B.

State Finance Chairmen were selected in Colorado and Rhode Island for a total of 34. Florida remains the only state among the first five primary states not to have a Finance Chairman at this time. A copy of the Finance Chairmen is attached at Tab C.

III. LEGAL

The Federal Election Commission is moving toward decisions on several significant questions. The Commission conducted a preliminary discussion on Presidential travel and the payment of related expenditures by the Republican National Committee. It now appears likely, although the FEC could once again change its position, that a middle position along the lines of our proposed formula will be adopted. Secondly, the FEC has decided to delay issuance of its SUN-PAC decision as a result of a Justice Department request for an extension. November 18 now appears to be the date for a final decision.

Finally, an Advisory Opinion was issued by unanimous agreement that will permit a donor to make an unearmarked \$25,000 to the RNC in 1975 without precluding a similar contribution in 1976. The practical effect of this Opinion is to increase the RNC's potential as a fundraising organization.

IV. CONVENTION PLANNING

Stan Anderson has formally submitted to Ody Fish our initial requests for Convention housing and Kemper Arena facilities, and Ody has responded favorably that he considers our proposals reasonable and acceptable. Ody has confirmed privately that he foresees no problem in insuring that friendly delegations would be housed at the Crown Center. A rough proposed budget totaling \$488,492.80 has been prepared for future refinement. We are placing greater emphasis at this time on politically-oriented considerations than was given in 1972.
