[Gen. Scowcroft handed over the US note on Cambodia, which Mr. Han read.]

Han Hsu: I will report to my government and convey any answer which may be forthcoming.

Let me make a personal observation. The chinese word has always counted. It was only the circumstances we explained in our note of July 18.

Scowcroft: You understand the context of my statement? We had relied on the Chinese to pass our proposal to Prince Sihanouk.
