Han Hsu: Legal procedure is internal matter. But you must guarantee security.

Your explanation is a mere pretext. The coming of the aircraft is a normal diplomatic activity which should be guaranteed.

As for whether it is blackmail or not, the question was put forward in such a way that we think it could not have taken place without direction of the U.S. side.
