At a dinner for the head of state of another country, we invite guests to reflect the interests and background of the honored guest. We also want to have these visitors from other countries meet some interesting Americans and to showcase some of our fine American talent. Like any good party, we like to have a mixture of people from many different occupations.

There is also a lot of more informal entertaining at the White House. The President and I, sometimes together and sometimes separately, have afternoon receptions for special groups. Again, we try to see that these groups represent many sections of our country and many interests.

Entertaining is perhaps more important for us than ever in our lives, because the White House does restrict our ability to meet people in a relaxed way. At these dinners and receptions, we can meet and talk to people. We've found that most people are relaxed in the White House, and we do get a chance to meet and talk to people we would not get to meet ordinarily.



And the reason I think of this verse is because the mastectomy I had alerted so many other women to breast cancer. Of course, the operation was a very difficult experience for me and my family, but it really did make me feel better emotionally to know how many lives my experience may have saved.

I know that if this had happened to me at another time in my life, it would not have had the same impact in the news, and so I feel very fortunate that something positive came out of my illness.
