Both Congressmen Robin Beard and Carroll Hubbard have contacted us, urging that the President sign as soon as possible HR-11510, a bill to provide for starling and blackbird control in Tennessee and Kentucky. This bill was authored by all Members of the Congressional delegation from Tennessee and Kentucky. HR-11510 passed both the House and Senate on Tuesday, January 27, 1976.
