

Both the House and Senate have now passed the FY 76 foreign assistance appropriations bill and the legislation is expected to go to

conference Tuesday, March 30. The Senatepassed bill contains a total of \$629 million in additional security assistance funds for the Middle East during the Transition Quarter virtually all of which is above your budget request. This figure consists of \$212 million in FMS credits with \$206 million (total sales level of \$375 million) earmarked for Israel. and \$417.1 million in security supporting assistance, with \$175 million earmarked for Israel. The House-passed bill contains no additional security assistance funding for the TQ, consistent with Chairman Passman's undertaking to you not to add such funds in his markup of the House bill. Passman has since indicated, however, that he would concede to the Senate position on TQ funding. Hence this meeting is necessary to reemphasize that you are strongly opposed to additional, selective funding for this period and will veto the legislation if the Senate levels are adopted by the conferees.

Many Members of the House of Representatives have, from time to time. expressed a desire to obtain a better insight into the nature of the military capability of the Soviet Union and the manner in which that capability affects our national security.

Members of the various standing Committees whose jurisdiction relates to military matters are provided this information in a variety of forms, but unfortunately few other Members of the House have access to this sensitive information.

In view of this circumstance, I have arranged to have representatives of the Department of Defense provide a special briefing regarding significant Soviet military and technological capabilities. This briefing must, because of the sensitivity of the subject matter and the various charts and photographs which will be used, be on a classified basis, and therefore limited to Members of Congress only.

This classified briefing is scheduled to be provided in the Caucus Room of the Cannon House Office Building on Friday, March 5, 1976, at 10:00 a.m. Also. for those Members who may find this time inconvenient, a repeat of this briefing will be given in the Caucus Room of the Cannon House Office Building on Monday. March 8, 1976, at 2:00 p.m.

The time allotted for the briefing, including questions from Members, is estimated at approximately two hours.

The costs of national defense are high; consequently, I believe it would be most helpful if every Member of the House, prior to House consideration of the First Concurrent Budget Resolution, became more familiar with the latest intelligence assessment of the military capability of the Soviet Union.
