 mismanagement, misuse of funds and sexual
 misconduct.
- 3. The Senators and Congressmen are anxious to have new leadership installed at the Commission.

Dear Mr. President:

On April 27, 1976, I requested for myself and on behalf of Congressman John Buchanan and Senators Harrison A. Williams, Jr. and Jacob K. Javits, a meeting with you at the earliest possible time to discuss the present situation at the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission. I regret that it has not been possible for you to schedule such a meeting as of this date.

As Chairman of the House Subcommittee on Equal Opportunities, I have long been concerned with the continuing failure of the EEOC to provide prompt and equitable redress for the victims of employment discrimination. It is my belief that this failure is due in large part to glaring management deficiencies of long standing which have recently surfaced in the public disclosure of certain internal audits of district office operations performed at the request of Chairman Lowell W. Perry. The departure of Chairman Perry after less than a year in office leaves most of these management deficiencies unresolved. I believe that the instability of leadership at the Commission has contributed substantially to these deficiencies.

I would again like to request an opportunity to me<u>et with you to discuss</u> these concerns prior to your appointment of a successor to Mr. Perry. The need for restoration of the public's confidence in its law enforcement agencies, I believe, makes this matter one of great urgency.
