BACKGROUND:

8:40 p.m.

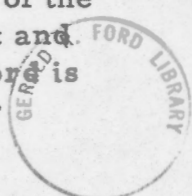

After brief remarks by Mr. Whyte, he presents the Scouter of the Year Award to you.

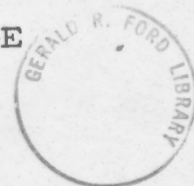
You step forward to accept the Award from two Boy Scouts. A Cub Scout will present flowers to Mrs. Ford while she remains seated.

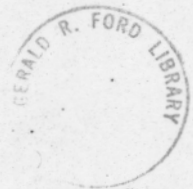
