BACKGROUND

The U.S. Historical Society has just completed a major film project "Washington - A City out of the Wilderness," which will be previewed on Sunday, January 26, 1975. The film will be distributed nationwide and featured at the National Visitors Center as a part of the Capitol Bicentennial Program.

The next project of this organization will be a sound and light show at the U.S. Capitol entitled "Our Capitol: Freedom Speaks" with which it hopes to raise the amount of ten million dollars. This project will be announced following the "Capitol" film preview. Mrs. Ford has accepted the position of honorary co-chairperson for this project and will attend a National Advisory Board meeting prior to the preview.
