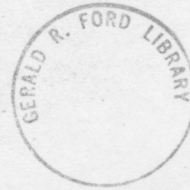

At the conclusion of the WZZM-TV Interview, you proceed to an adjacent room for your WGN-TV Interview.

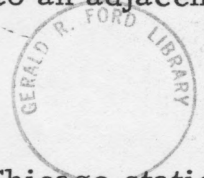

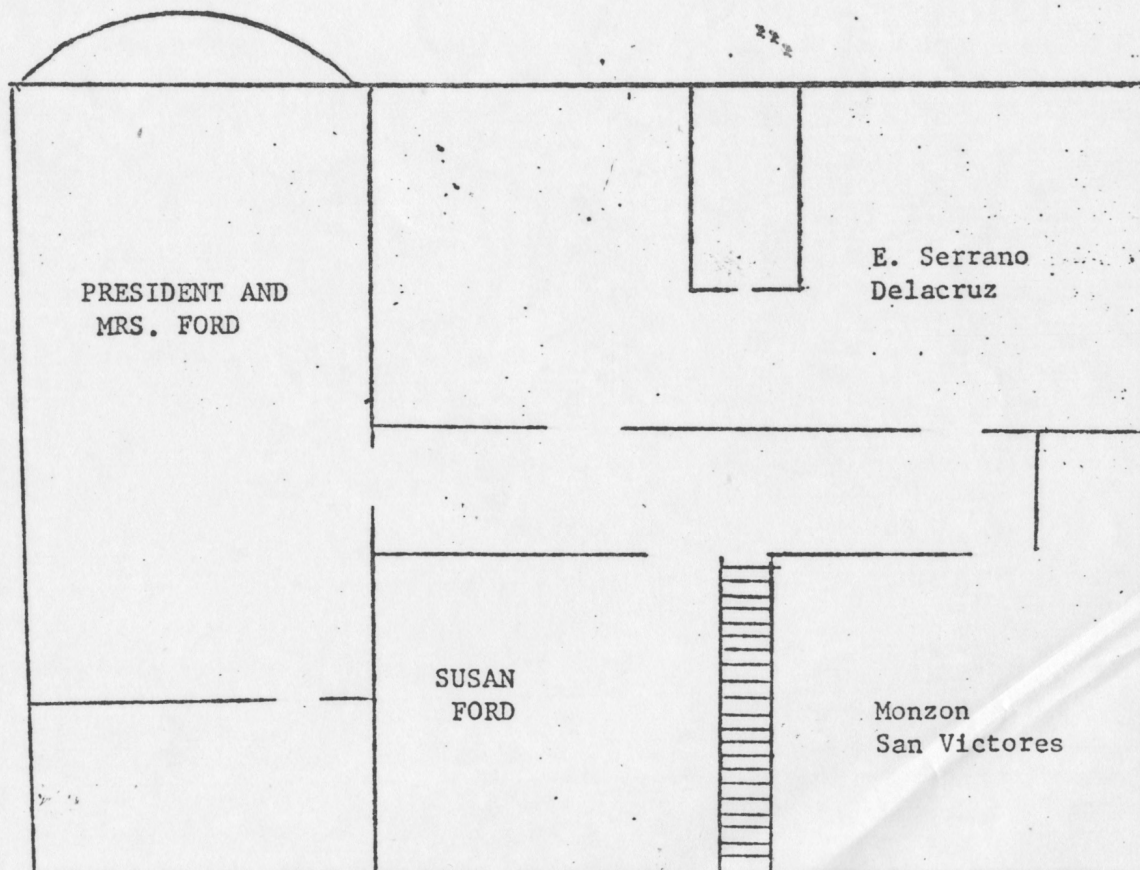




WELCH RESIDENCE - 2747 DARBY
FIRST FLOOR

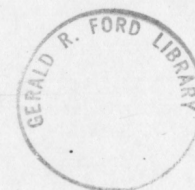


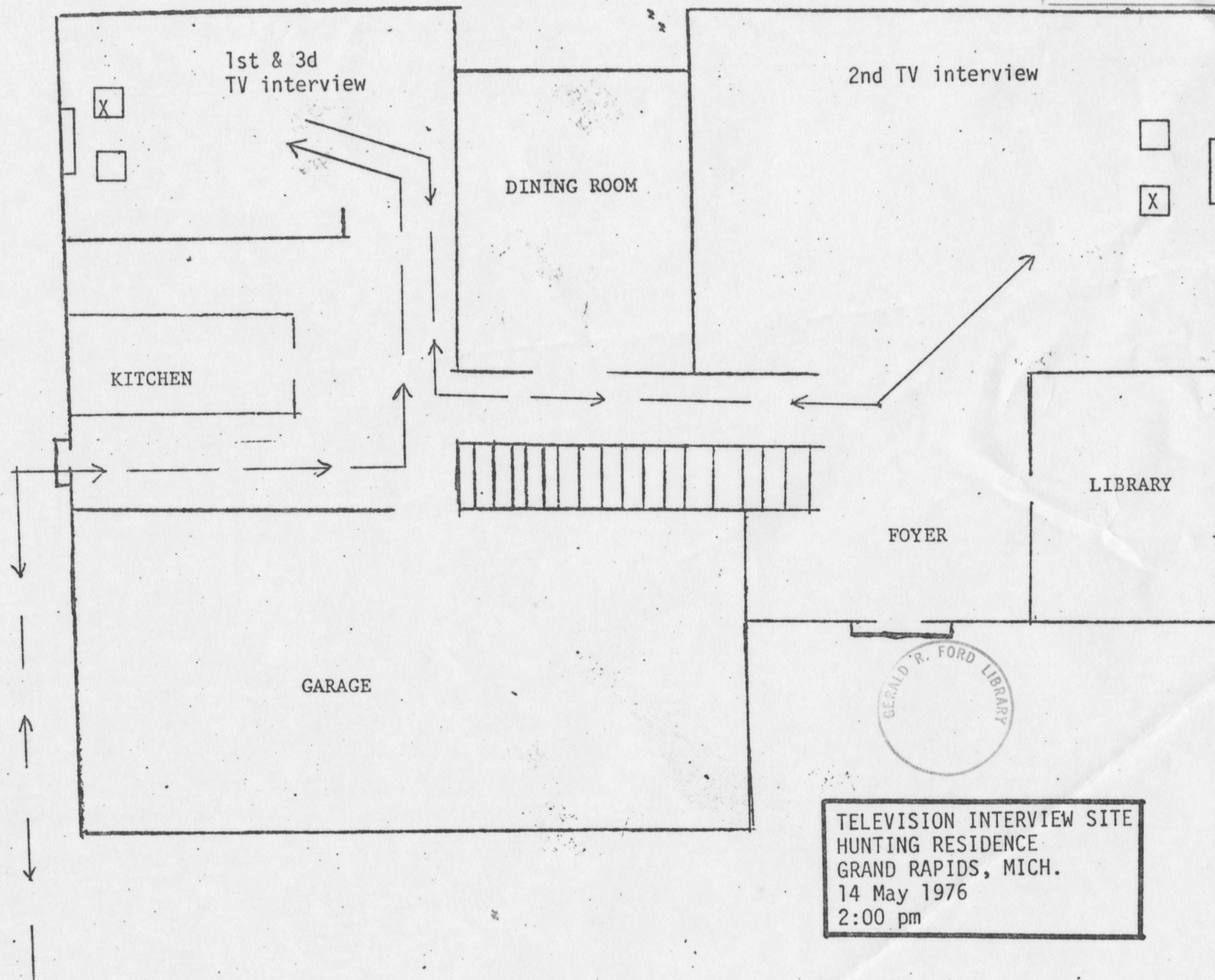
RESIDENCE DIAGRAM
