The attached book was given to Mrs. Ford at the Martin Steinberg Center Dedication on June 22 by Bertie G. Schwartz. Also attached is a mezuzah which was presented to Mrs. Ford (She was most honored to receive it) Could you please have it sent to Mrs. Ford after cataloguing.

At the Jewish National Fund National Bicentennial Dinner last evening Mrs. Ford was presented a beautiful Bible from Jerusalem. It is bound in a silver metal cover and has four aqua stones framing an emblem of a crown and tablets of the Ten Commandments. I will get it sent over at a later date. It is inscribed: "To our beloved First Lady, Mrs. Betty Ford, who graced our festive occasion with her shining spirit" Gala National Bicentennial Dinner of the Jewish National Fund of America, The New York Hilton, June 22, 1976. It is signed by Abram Salamon, Executive Vice President and Dr. Maurice Sage, President. (Dr. Sage suffered a heart attack and passed away that evening). Attached is information which may be helpful. David Lissey of the White House staff was present at this event and may be helpful in any further explanations of the significance of these items.

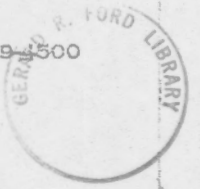
