BACKGROUND

You and Mrs. Ford will depart the South Grounds at 6:25 p.m. to attend a reception hosted by Chancellor and Mrs. Helmut Schmidt onboard the German Sailing Training Vessel "Gorch Fock" anchored in Baltimore's Inner Harbor. The Gorch Fock has been docked there since July 10 and will depart Baltimore on July 17. (Background information on "Gorch Fock" enclosed.)

Mayor William D. Schaefer will greet you at the Helicopter Landing pad and escort you on foot to the Baltimore Clipper Ship construction site where Chancellor and Mrs. Schmidt will meet you. The City of Baltimore has retained twelve maritime craftsmen from various parts of the world to build a replica of the pre-Revolutionary "Baltimore Clipper" Ship -- a ship that was manufactured in Baltimore and was known for its lightness, fast speed and streamlined form. It will contain only the materials available in pre-Revolutionary days and will be an accurate historic replica in every way possible. Because of their speed, Clippers were used during 1775 and 1815 to dodge British cruisers which blockaded the coast or patrolled the seas during the American Revolution, the War of 1812, and the hectic intervening years of neutral trading.

The "Gorch Fock" crew will man the yardarms for your arrival and you will be hailed with three rounds of cheers from the crew. Before mingling with the guests (List attached at TAB A), you will be taken on a tour of the ship, sign the guest book, and receive a macrame entwined plaque with the ship's crest. After this informal presentation, you will mingle with the guests until 7:50 p.m. at which time you will deliver brief remarks to the ship's guests.

Chancellor and Mrs. Schmidt arrive and are introduced to you by the Acting Chief of Protocol, the Honorable Stuart W. Rockwell. You in turn introduce them to Secretary and Mrs. Kissinger and General and Mrs. George Brown.

You and the Chancellor move to the platform and stand facing the troops with the Chancellor on your right. Mrs. Ford and Mrs. Schmidt move to right of platform.



10:31 a.m.

National Anthems and 19-gun salute.

Inspection of troops - you and Chancellor Schmidt guided by Commander of troops. Chancellor Schmidt should be on the left closest to the troops. The Troop Commander is in the middle.

NOTE: Your cue for escorting the Chancellor down to the Commander of Troops to inspect the troops will be the Commander's report, "Sir, the Honor Guard is formed."

Inspection begins at the right front of the band and proceeds along the front rank of troops. You render a salute when passing in front of the Colors.

At the left flank of the troops, the Inspection Party turns and proceeds toward the platform.

You escort the Chancellor onto the platform and take your original positions facing the troop for the Marine Drum and Bugle Corps "pass in review."

The President and Mrs. Ford will host a black-tie dinner in honor of His Excellency the Chancellor of the Federal Republic of Germany and Mrs. Schmidt Thursday, July 15.

The dinner will be held in the Rose Garden under a white canopy. Woodcarved American birds will be featured in the table decorations. The carvings, made from basswood of the linden tree, include an elf owl on a saguaro cactus, a Carolina parakeet surrounded by blossoming dogwood, a pair of ground dove with apple blossoms and a male green wing teal drake with morning glory. These carvings will be accented with flowers of complimentary colors. The garden birds will be coordinated with garden flowers, and the field birds with cactus or greenery.

The rectangular head table at the north end of the garden and the 16 round tables will be covered with a Scalamandre print of Summer Flora.

Tables will be set with the Johnson China, vermeil flatwear and Morgantown crystal.

Jack Drake, carver of the centerpieces and minister from Carlsbad, New Mexico, will coordinate the decorations. The carvings are on loan from the Baker Gallery of Fine Art in Lubbock, Texas, and one from the Smithsonian's Museum of Natural History.

Following dinner, Phyllis Curtin, leading soprano with the Metropolitan Opera and the Vienna State Opera, will entertain in the East Room of the White House. After the entertainment, music for dancing will be provided by the Marine Dance Orchestra in the State Dining Room.

The President and Mrs. Ford have invited opera soprano Phyllis Curtin to entertain Thursday, July 15, at the State Dinner honoring His Excellency, The Chancellor of the Federal Republic of Germany and Mrs. Schmidt.

This will be Phyllis Curtin's first appearance at the White House. She has performed in North and South America as well as in Europe and is currently heard in the operatic recital and orchestral repertoire throughout the United States. She is known for her roles in both classic and contemporary opera.

In the 1950's, Miss Curtin won international acclaim for her performance of the title role in Strauss' "Salome" with the New York City Opera. She subsequently debuted at the Vienna State Opera and at Milan's La Scala. In 1961, she appeared with the Metropolitan Opera in Mozart's "Cosi Fan Tutte." Other performances include: Mozart's "Don Giovanni;" Puccini's "Madama Butterfly;" and Carlisle Floyd's "Susannah" and "Wuthering Heights."

Miss Curtin has also appeared in the major music festivals in the country, including: Tanglewood Music Festival with the Boston Symphony Orchestra and the Blossom festival with the Cleveland Orchestra.

She has a great interest in American contemporary composers, and records their music for RCA, Columbia and Desto. She also teaches graduate courses to voice students at Yale University.

Phyllis Curtin was born in Clarksburg, West Virginia and now lives in Hamden, Connecticut. She is married to Eugene Cook and they have a teenage daughter, Claudia.

Miss Curtin is a political science graduate of Wellesley College and has studied voice privately throughout the East Coast.
