Departure from the South Lawn will be at 2:25 p.m. Upon arrival at Andrews Air Force Base, you will join Sen. Henry Bellmon (R-Okla); Sen. Dewey F. Bartlett (R-Okla); Rep. Tom Steed (D-Okla); Rep. John Jarmon (R-Okla); Rep. Theodore Risenhoover (D-Okla) who will be your guests aboard Air Force One en route Tinker Air Force Base, Oklahoma City. Flying time will be 2 hours, 45 minutes. Time change: -1 hour.

TINKER AIR FORCE BASE ARRIVAL

You will arrive at Tinker Air Force Base at 4:30 p.m., CDT. You will be met by Paula Unruh, GOP State Chairman; William Gooden, GOP State Vice-Chairman; H.H. Champlin, GOP State Finance Chairman; "Skip" Healy, National Committeeman and Grace W. Boulton, National Committeewoman.



OKLAHOMA STATE FAIR

You accepted the invitation of former Governor David Hall to attend this year's Oklahoma State Fair. Governor David L. Boren reissued the invitation upon his assumption of the Office of Governor. You will be visiting the fair on its opening day and, following a tour, will address approximately 25,000 people who will be gathered under the newly created Independence Arch. In honor of the Bicentennial, the theme of this year's 69th State Fair of Oklahoma is "Spirit of American Exposition." In addition to dedicating the newly constructed Independence Arch and Constitution Fountain, you will light a huge (8-1/2 feet high by 5-1/2 feet round) birthday cake. Governor Boren, Senator Bartlett, Senator Bellmon and Congressman Jarmon will accompany you throughout your stay at the Fair.

The Fair is the fifth largest in the U.S. and will have the largest international livestock show in the world. As a chartered, self-supporting, non-profit corporation, it is one of the few totally independent State Fairs. It accepts no funds from the State. Its purpose is to serve as a public institution to reflect and promote Oklahoma's progress in Agriculture, industry, commerce, education and culture and to provide a medium of social exchange. The facilities of the Fair are used all year round by the City. Admission to the fair is \$1.00 but everyone will be admitted free on the day of your visit.

The Oklahoma State Fair is claimed to be the first Bicentennial State Fair in the Nation. The Independence Arch bears the inscription from the Declaration of Independence, "When in the course of human events....". The Constitution Fountain will feature the entire Preamble of the Constitution around its circumference. The Old Guard Drum and Fife Corps from Washington, D.C. will take part in the ceremony. Also permanently displayed will be four 100-year-old carriages.

LBJ visited the Fair in 1965 and while there, borrowed someone's horse and rode across the fair grounds. Mrs. Nixon attended the Fair several years ago as First Lady. President Truman also attended when he was campaigning against Dewey.

Some points of State pride: Oklahoma ranks second in the Nation for breeding quarter horses, third in the production of wheat, third in the production of natural gas (following Texas and Louisiana) and according to the latest polls, the "Sooners" are first in the Nation in College Football. Bryce Harlow's brother, James, is on the Fair Board and will be attendance for your speech. Last December Steve Ford attended Oklahoma City's "World Series of Rodeo". Patience Latting (D) is Mayor of Oklahoma City.

GOP FUNDRAISERS

Following the Fair you will attend two fundraiser receptions at the Lincoln Plaza Hotel in Oklahoma City. Upon arrival you will attend the joint "Gold Trunk and Diamond Trunk" reception for \$1,000 and \$3,000 contributors respectively. Approximately 50 are expected to attend (no remarks). Next you will attend the "Bronze and Silver Trunk" reception. The "Bronze Trunk" is made up of contributors of \$100.00 to \$500.00 and the "Silver Trunk" is made up of contributors of \$500.00 to \$1,000.00. About 1,000 are expected to attend. (Remarks) Paula Unruh, Oklahoma State Chairman, will be your hostess for both receptions. She was elected in March as the first woman State Chairman in Oklahoma's history. She was former campaign manager and staff member for Page Belcher. Bud Champlin is State Finance Chairman. Other key personages: Nancy Apgar, County Chairman, Bill McLean, Event Chairman; Mrs. Jose Freede, Reception Co-chairman; Mrs. Betty Ellis, Reception Co-chairman. Jack Black is Chairman of the Oklahoma President Ford Finance Committee (hosted last Saturday's VP fundraiser).

Skip Healy, the National Committeeman and Grace Bowlton, the National Committeewoman are openly pro-Reagan. Reagan will be in Tulsa on November 14th for a fundraiser. Vice President Rockefeller visited Oklahoma last Saturday to attend the Oklahoma-Oregon football game and a Norman, Oklahoma fundraiser.

You visited Oklahoma City (Fundraiser breakfast and campaign rally) on October 22, 1974 on behalf of Senator Bellmon and other GOP candidates.

OKLAHOMA REPUBLICAN PARTY

Oklahoma Republicans are on the whole conservative, and the Oklahoma Republican Party has had what RNC sources describe as a heavy "philosophical orientation" for the past six years under former State Chairman, Clarence Warner. Under the leadership of the new State Chairman, Paula Unruh, the State GOP is becoming increasingly "organization oriented," and RNC field reports indicate that the RNC/State Committee relationship is the best it has been in a number of years. Mrs. Unruh is described as an attractive, well-organized, strong State Chairman who is moving aggressively to prepare the State Party for the 1976 elections. A full-time, paid chairman, she has undertaken a heavy travel schedule around the state to work personally with county Party leaders and elected officials. As part of this new effort, a series of statewide seminars and workshops will take place beginning next week. A moderate, she received strong support in her bid for the chairmanship from Senator Bellmon, and she is reported by RNC sources to be unpopular among some of the Party's conservatives. She has publicly maintained neutrality concerning the GOP Presidential nomination, although she is said privately to support your candidacy.



Oklahoma Republican Party

The majority of the Party hierarchy, according to RNC field reports, are supportive of Ronald Reagan's potential bid for the Presidential nomination. Reagan is openly supported by the Republican National Committeeman and Committeewoman, and his committee in the State was briefly chaired by the former GOP State Chairman, Clarence Warner. It is now headed by Albert Snipes, an insurance man and former GOP County Chairman.

The State of Oklahoma will be represented by 36 delegates at the Republican National Convention in 1976. There is no primary and delegates are chosen by State and Congressional District conventions. Field reports indicate that in the event of a contest for the Presidential nomination the delegates will probably split evenly between those supporting your candidacy and those favoring Ronald Reagan.

Congressman John Jarman is the only major Republican officeholder to have publicly stated his support for your candidacy at this time. He has written you to that effect. It is felt that his support will be very helpful in the State after the National Convention. Neither Senator Bartlett nor Senator Bellmon have publicly indicated whom they will support in event of a contest for the Presidential nomination, and according to field sources both are deliberately remaining neutral at this time.



Oklahoma Republican Party

The State Party is in the black financially, and just completed two fundraising events last weekend with Vice President Rockefeller as the focal point. State Party headquarters estimates that around \$50,000 was grossed at those events in Norman and Enid. Ronald Reagan will visit Oklahoma for a fundraiser in Tulsa on November 14th.

According to field reports, the Rockefeller visit was not received well by conservative elements in the Party and served to exacerbate bad feelings of those elements toward the moderate State Chairman, Mrs. Unruh.

There are no major statewide races in 1976 in Oklahoma. Opportunities for Republican gains in the State Legislative races are thought by RNC sources to be marginal except in the major metropolitan areas of Tulsa and Oklahoma City. The State Legislature is presently heavily controlled by Democrats (State Senate: 6R, 18D; State House, 25R, 76D).

In the 1976 Congressional races, RNC and state Party sources indicate that a concentrated effort will be made to win back the 6th Congressional District seat formerly held by Republican Happy Camp, who was defeated in 1974. At this time, no GOP candidate for that seat has emerged, however. RNC sources feel that John Jarman's 5th District seat can be retained by Republicans when Jarman retires at the end of this session. It is also thought that a formidable Republican candidate would have good potential in the 1st District against Democrat James Jones.

Jess Marlow - KNBC evening news anchorman and a regular panelist on "News Conference". He has been with KNBC since August, 1966.

Warren Olney - Anchorman of the weekend news, formerly a CBS Capitol Hill Correspondent. He has been with KNBC since May, 1975.

As Vice President, you appeared on the "News Conference" program which was taped on April 20, 1974 in San Jose.

Following the interview you will return to your suite for 5 minutes and then depart the hotel via motorcade to the Santa Monica Airport helopad.

PEPPERDINE UNIVERSITY

Following the 15 minute helicopter flight and a short motorcade, you will arrive at Dr. William Banowsky's residence at Pepperdine University to attend a 50 minute brunch attended by 300 special guests where you will participate in an informal dedication ceremony of the residence, known as the Brock House, which will serve as a permanent home for the University President. Mrs. Brock whose financial assistance made construction of the residence possible has been called "Mrs. Republican" of California. She is one of the few women to serve on the Republican National Finance Committee and has been extremely active in state GOP affairs.

Following the brunch you will proceed via motorcade with the Banowskys to the Firestone Fieldhouse where you will don the academic robe and meet briefly with 12 student leaders. You and Dr. Banowsky will then proceed to an outside amphitheatre to receive the honorary Doctor of Laws degree and deliver remarks which will be broadcast on live local television. The public has been invited to join the students at the ceremony.

Others who will participate in the special convocation include Ambassador Firestone, John Wayne, Pat Boone and, of course, President Banowsky and the Pepperdine faculty.

Pepperdine University has an enrollment of about 8,000 students on three California campuses, Los Angeles, Orange County and Malibu, the newest and largest campus and the site of your visit. The University began in 1937 when George Pepperdine donated profits from his multi-million dollar Western Auto Supply Company to establish the College at the present Los Angeles campus. It is an independent institution guided by a self-perpetuating Board of Trustees.



The Pepperdine Malibu Campus opened in September of 1972. It is located in the magnificent site where the Santa Monica mountains reach the Pacific. There are 1,800 students enrolled at the Malibu campus with approximately 1,000 living in campus dorms. The school is very athletic minded; last season's "Waves" basketball team finished with a 19 and 8 record. The volleyball squad was ranked #3 nationally; the tennis team finished 9th place nationally and the baseball team won the West Coast Atlantic Conference for the second straight year.

Dr. Banowsky received his BA from David Liscomb College in Tennessee where he attended on a baseball scholarship; his MA from the University of New Mexico and his PhD in Communications at the University of Southern California. He is the Republican National Committeeman for California. Dr. Banowsky writes a regular column in the Los Angeles Herald Examiner and hosts a weekly television program, INQUIRY, on KNBC-TV.

Pepperdine University's Chancellor and former University President, M. Norvel Young, was involved in a tragic driving accident Tuesday evening resulting in the death of at least one passenger. Young was held on suspicion of manslaughter and drunk driving.

He made his acceptance speech from the Stanford Stadium. The Hoover Institute is located on the campus.



BACKGROUND:

AFL-CIO BUILDING AND TRADES DEPARTMENT

You are scheduled to depart the residence at 9:30 a.m. for departure aboard Air Force One from Monterey Peninsula Airport en route San Francisco (Flying Time: 30 minutes). Upon arrival, you proceed directly to the Hyatt Hotel to address the Annual Building Trades Convention, a gathering of approximately 550 members who will be in attendance at this business session.

In 1908, the Building and Construction Trades Department was chartered by the American Federation of Labor. The Department was to be composed of national and international building trades organizations which are primarily engaged in the building and construction trades industry. Today, 17 national and international unions are affiliated with the Department and represent over 4 million building tradesmen.

The Department, which is one of six in the AFL-CIO, was established to coordinate and harmonize the activities, functions and interests of the affiliated unions. More specifically, the Department is charged with a number of objectives. To cite a few, the Department is to promote the growth of building trades unions, foster apprenticeship training in the industry, advance health and safety practices, secure the adjustment of jurisdictional disputes, assist all affiliates in securing improved wages, hours and working conditions and engage in legislative and research activities designed to assure the interests of building tradesmen.



The construction industry is this nation's largest industry, larger than the steel and auto industries combined, accounting for over 10 percent of our GNP and employing a work force of nearly six million workers during the course of one year.

The industry is unquestionably one of the country's most complicated industries. Thousands of contractors, over 75 percent of whom employ less than 25 workers, and equal numbers of local unions interact to create a picture that many observers have described as diverse, decentralized and downright confusing.

Following your appearance at the Building and Trades Convention, you proceed to the St. Francis Hotel, and after 15-minutes personal time, join the World Affairs Council for a luncheon.

WORLD AFFAIRS COUNCIL

Approximately 1,000 members of the 5000-member World Affairs Council will be on hand. Your participation includes attendance at a General Reception (10 minutes) where you informally greet the assembled members, a head table reception (Attendance: 20), then remarks and a Q and A session along the lines of the recent White House Conferences.

The World Affairs Council of Northern California was formed in 1947 and is a non-profit, educational organization which is solely supported by contributions from its 5,000 individual and corporate members. It has established a resource center for services to high schools in the San Francisco Bay area. It provides speakers and educational materials in the field of international affairs. Each month during the school year, the Council publishes Colloquy an informational bulletin for schools and distributes this to 3,400 social science teachers in the San Francisco Bay area. The Council also publishes

Latin American Report, a digest of important Latin American economic and political developments with approximately 550 subscribers throughout the United States and abroad.

Khrushchev, Nehru, DeGaulle, and President Kennedy are among the world figures who have appeared before the Council.

Following your appearance, you return to your Suite for 30-minutes personal time.



BACKGROUNDER ON GREATER CLEVELAND CONGRESS FOR IWY

Cleveland's IWY Conference is probably the biggest IWY celebration in the country. They are expecting 30,000 people over a 3-day period, and have 140 different workshops and seminars for people to visit and participate in. It is entirely free and open to the public.

This has been entirely a community project, starting with about 40 women who thought it would be a good idea and kept at it. A lot of the impetus has come from Gwill York, an ex-Junior League President and housewife with 2 children, who volunteered for the full-time job as Chairperson and has done a terrific job-- in organization, in raising funds, and in handling people.

The organizers (more than 100 women's groups are involved) are homemakers, career women, and volunteers. Their common ground: most have had no previous identification with the women's movement; they have a belief that women must cooperate with men to achieve equality; they endorse choice for women in choosing their roles; and they greatly support the family (most are wives, widows, and mothers).

Your audience will be about 3,000 people in an old auditorium with a cozy, intimate feeling to it (it appears to hold about a third of that number). The TV cameras are straight ahead of you in the audience, about 60 feet back.

Madam Pandit is sister to the late Prime Minister Nehru and a confidante of Gandhi. She became known internationally when she led the Indian delegation to the UN in 1946. In 1953 she was elected UN Assembly President, the first and only woman to hold that title. She later served India as Ambassador to Britain, the United States, and Russia. Her views on feminism might be summed up in this quote (20 years ago): "All my political training has taught me to look at myself as an individual and not as a woman." Madam Pandit is 75 years old.

Dorothy Fuldheim, one of the guests in your private luncheon, is one of Cleveland's notables. She is 83. She still works nine hours a day as a broadcaster for WEWS-TV, the local ABC



affiliate. She has interviewed six Presidents, Hitler, Kings, Queens, all the major candidates, etc., and has a national reputation. She has been described as "elegant," very much a lady, and is evidently quite a personality. The IWY people wanted her in the luncheon because they consider her a very visible, outstanding example of what women can do.

The organizers have stressed that there is nothing political about the Congress. Their purpose is to raise the consciousness of the community and to improve the quality of their daily lives--men as well as women.

The Congress also includes more than 200 exhibits and displays by women's organizations, civic and cultural institutions, businesses and government agencies.

Other guests during the Congress: comedienne Lily Tomlin; Phyllis Gillis, Executive Director of the Gallup Institute, who will release results of the latest Gallup poll on "what do women really want and think"; syndicated columnist Ann Landers; tennis pro and TV commentator Julie Heldman; Lynn Caine, author of the book, Widow; Constance B. Newman, Vice Chairman of the Consumer Product Safety Commission; and television psychologist Sonya Friedman.

The Congress will open at 9:00 a.m., however, they are counting on Mrs. Ford's arriving in time to participate at 12:30 in the Music Hall of the Convention Center, the big assembly hall. They are quite agreeable to Mrs. Ford making brief remarks at this time along with Mrs. Pandit. I might also mention that the subject of a gift to Mrs. Ford was raised so they may wish to make a presentation to her at this time.



As we discussed, I believe the schedule will now permit Mrs. Ford to leave Washington around 9:00 a.m. and return to Washington early afternoon. I think the idea of a small private luncheon is a good one and also whether Mrs. Ford visits any of their exhibits I think should be determined by you and Patti.

Mrs. Ford was invited to Cleveland to participate in the 60th anniversary of the Cleveland Play House^{ON OCTOBER 17th.}. Writing on behalf of this invitation were Mayor Perk, former Congresswoman Frances Bolton (R-Ohio) and her son Kenyon Bolton, President of the Cleveland Play House Foundation and active Republican. Were it possible to include Mayor Perk and perhaps former Congresswoman Bolton at some point--perhaps meet at the airport and/or be included in a private luncheon--might be valuable. Mrs. Ford's visit to Cleveland may hopefully help to lessen Cleveland's disappointment at not being the site for the 1976 Republican National Convention.

I have also attached a copy of a letter to Mrs. Ford from a former friend of hers in Grand Rapids, Verna Hewer Stevens who is now living in Cleveland. In preparing the Proposed Schedule package for the President regarding his visit with President Sadat, the issue of you and Mrs. Sadat was raised by the Egyptian Pre-Advance Team. They offered the following:

1. Mrs. Sadat did not wish to participate in any planned activities for Sunday night, November 2, 1975. This is probably due to the fact that on Sunday Mrs. Sadat plans to spend the day at Disneyworld with her children.
2. As far as the Egyptians are concerned, they do not want you to feel bound to any social obligations in Florida with regard to Mrs. Sadat's schedule.

Additionally, Governor Askew, who will host a Florida dinner in honor of the two Presidents, has indicated his desire that such a dinner be a "stag" affair.

During his stay in Jacksonville, the President will be housed in a private residence on the Deerwood Country Club grounds. It is felt that accommodations here would also be most comfortable for you, if you choose to accompany the President.

BACKGROUND

On Thursday, October 16th, 1975, the Egyptian Pre-Advance Team visited Jacksonville, Florida, to survey housing proposed by the State Department for President Sadat and his family. The Egyptian team approved the use of Epping Forest, the St. John's Riverside estate of Mr. and Mrs. Ray Mason of Charter Oil. The State Department Protocol Office, acting on guidance from Secretary Kissinger, located two small resort houses at Jacksonville Beach as proposed locations for Head-to-Head meetings, if an overnight were involved. Jacksonville Beach is approximately 30 minutes driving time from Epping Forest.



Upon return to Washington, it was learned that the President would not remain overnight in Jacksonville, rather limit the visit to one day of activity on Sunday, November 2nd, 1975. The attached Proposed Schedule is recommended and offers a centralization of activities in the Epping Forest area, rather than in the less preferred Jacksonville Beach area.

ARRIVAL

Air Force One will land at Jacksonville Naval Air Station with the President being greeted by base personnel and their families in an informal arrival ceremony. Air Force One could be parked within walking distance of the boat dock and thus provide a unique arrival/departure situation. Immediately following the Air Force One arrival, the President would travel across the St. John's River via motor launch and dock at Epping Forest, where he would be greeted by President Sadat and begin the Working Luncheon at Epping Forest. (NOTE: President Sadat would have arrived the day prior, utilizing the same mode of travel).

HEAD-TO-HEAD MEETINGS

The first meeting, a Working Luncheon, could be held on the patio of the Epping Forest dock boathouse. An office adjoins the patio, which would provide an air-conditioned room for after-lunch talks, if desired. Such a plan would keep the talks at a good distance from the main house and preserve the Sadat family privacy, although it is expected that Mrs. Sadat and her children will visit Disneyworld on Sunday.

The second meeting, a Head-to-Head, would be held at President Ford's residence, which would be located nearby Epping Forest.

The third meeting, a third-party hosted Dinner, could be held at a local Country Club or private residence. It should be noted that Hassan Kamel indicated on several occasions during the Pre-Advance that Mrs. Sadat preferred to rest while in Florida and not be committed to evening events. Additionally, he inferred that



she would probably visit Disneyworld with her children on Sunday -- a fact that was later confirmed.

Governor Askew has agreed to host a dinner in Jacksonville in honor of the two Presidents. While he has left a great deal of the planning to the State Department Office of Protocol, he has indicated his desire that the dinner be a "stag affair." Is a stag dinner acceptable to the President?
