## BACKGROUND

You, and Mrs. Ford, if she is available to attend, will depart the Bass Residence at 6:10 p.m. this evening via motorcade en route Mayor Dobson's Residence to attend an informal reception (approximately 24 guests -- list at Tab A) with the local government representatives. You are scheduled to stay at the reception for approximately one-half hour.

Sometime during the reception you will step out with the Mayor to the back yard to present the American Revolution Bi-Centennial Administration's Certificate of Official Recognition and the Bi-Centennial Flag for the town of Vail recognizing Vail's project, a museum devoted to "100 years of Colorado skiing." The museum will be a permanent repository for artifacts, documents and photographs depicting the history of skiing in the Colorado Rockies, how skis were used by miners, trappers and ranchers, Colorado ski troopers in the 10th Mountain Division, etc. A press photo is planned of the presentation.
