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Legal Matters

You should consult the Office of the Counsel to the President on all matters related to the performance of your official duties, which would include:

(a) Questions of interpretation of statutes, Executive Orders, and administrative rules and regulations.

(b) Questions of the probable legal effect of language in draft or enrolled bills or in proposed Executive Orders.

(c) The need or desirability of referring matters to the Department of Justice for an opinion or action.

(d) Any requested or contemplated contact which may fall within the scope of part 12 of the Standards of Conduct involving independent regulatory agencies or procurement agencies; also any requested or contemplated contact with a member of the Judiciary in his official capacity or with an employee of the Internal Revenue Service or of any Board, Division, or Bureau of the Department of Justice in his official capacity.

(e) Subpoenas, complaints and orders in any judicial or administrative proceedings or requests to be a witness therein when they relate to your official duties or those of another employee of the



Federal Government, and inquiries or requests made by an attorney or by a party to any such proceeding.

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Legal Guidance.



All distinctly legal questions and issues of legal policy should be referred to the Office of the Counsel to the President. No member of the White House Staff should seek direct advice on such matters from agencies outside the White House without the approval of the Office of the Counsel to the President.

Legal Clearance.

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All communications, oral as well as written, from White House Staff members to any regulatory agency, to a procurement agency regarding a particular contract, to a litigating division of the Department of Justice or communications on a distinctly legal issue, should be cleared with the Office of the Counsel to the President prior to mailing.



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
