FIRST LET ME SAY HOW MUCH I APPRECIATE THE HONOR YOU GIVE ME IN PRESENTING ME WITH THE NATIONAL FOOTBALL FOUNDATION AND HALL OF FAME'S GOLD MEDAL AWARD....I AM EQUALLY HONORED TO BE IN THIS ROOM WITH ALL OF YOU, BECAUSE I BELIEVE..... WHAT YOU STAND FOR..... REPRESENTS THE BEST WE HAVE IN OUR SOCIETY, AND THAT'S THE <u>OTHER</u> REASON I CAME HERE TONIGHT.

GERALD FORD'S SPEECH

NATIONAL FOOTBALL FOUNDATION AND HALL OF FAME, INC.

12/4/73

.....Thank you very, very much Vin. About a year ago tonight Dr. Brud Holland and I were honored by the Football Hall of Fame Foundation. I do not know exactly what's transpired in Brud's life over the last 12 months but there has been somewhat significant changes in my situation.

I would like to tell you one story following the announcement that there would be a new vice president. The President called Senator Scott down at the White House on that Friday morning to ask what the process and procedure would be in the Senate for the confirmation, and at 11 o'clock after the President had seen Hugh he asked me to come down and give him the procedure and process for the confirmation of the vice president in the house. Of course, during the course of this 30 minute conversation I did not get any hint or indication that it might fall my way. He did tell me that at 7:30PM that night he would call the individual that was to be selected. Well, we were busy on the floor of the House that afternoon and I went home for a swim and sit down for dinner with my wife and our teenage daughter.

Let me give you a description of the setup in the Ford household. We have downstairs a listed telephone number with five extensions - we have two teenage children. In the upstairs bedroom, we have an unlisted phone number with no extensions. Well, at 7:25PM the downstairs phone rang and it was my oldest son a Divinity student in Massachusettes had learned from a newscast at 7PM that his old man might get the nod and was all excited, and my wife was talking to him.

At 7:30PM the phone rang upstairs. Well, I was the only one not occupied - my daughter was helping my wife with the Dinner and so I dashed upstairs (faster than I had moved for sometime) and I answered the phone with no extension. The White House operator said, "The President wants to talk to you." He came on the line and said, "I have good news for you but I think you should get Betty on the extension." I thought quickly and said to myself I have got to get a good answer. I said, "Mr. President, I cant put Betty on this phone would you mind hanging up and calling back?" So I went downstairs and got Betty off the phone and then some 30-60 seconds that transpired. he didn't change his mind. You, I am sure have read about the investigation -----conducted about my personal and political life. It has been interesting I can assure you to have 350 FBI agents go around the country and 70 of them to overwhelm your own home town (which isn't too big), plus IRS and a few others. I did turn over to the committee everything they asked for except one letter. This is the first time I have revealed it to the public. After the nomination, I got a letter which reads like this:

Page 3

"Dear Mr. Ford: I was born in St. Johns, Michigan, and saw you play for the University of Michigan in several games. In one of those games you did not play very well. In fact, you played very badly (Ford: he didn't know how badly). The question I have is this: were you doped up, or could you have tried to throw that game, and should I report this to the confirmation people or Jack Anderson?"

I also remember vaguely - it was in 1930....that you also got up limping one time. Could you have been faking?" Maybe Jack Anderson would want to ask that question.

Well, it has been quite an experience and I am still at limbo and I might preface what I am going to say now because there has been a lot of kidding in the House. Let me say that as a good Wolverine alumni, I was disappointed but I wholeheartedly agree with Woody Hayes that once decisions are made we ought not to bellyache about it.

But, after that weekend, some of my friends on the floor of the House came up to me and said, Gerry, there is a rumor going around that the Ohio Delegation has a candidate and that the Big Ten Athletic Commissioners are going to make the decision.

Let me say that it has been a great year for me and that I am pleased and honored to be here tonight to see John Wayne get a Gold Medal. I am looking forward - and sometime within the next 40 hours or thereabouts, a former Michigander will try to help a bench warmer from Whittier College who was your recipient four years ago who has been faced with some tough problems in the last five years. He has had many decisions where it was third down and long yardage, but on balance, I think he has made a lot of first downs. I am looking forward to the opportunity of working with him, and I am sure all of you will give all of us the best support you can as we seek to meet the problems both at home and abroad.

It's a pleasure for me to be a guest at your annual awards dinner for the second year in a row. But I couldn't help thinking, as I sat there at the head table tonight, how different the circumstances are this evening as compared to that occasion 12 months ago.

Last year I came as a man who was being honored by the National Football Foundation to receive a gold medal. Tonight I'm here as a man who is being sweated into shape by the U.S. Congress to wear a brass hat.

Every now and then, though, something happens that makes all of us forget our own problems because of a tough break that happens to someone else. That's the way I felt as a Michigan football alumnus when they broke the news last week about Ohio State's invitation to the Rose Bowl. My wife said to me, "Jerry, if you think those House and Senate Committees are a tough crowd, just be grateful your confirmation is not up for a vote by the Big Ten athletic directors."

Well, what happened to Michigan is just one of the risks of the game, and that's one of the reasons why every true competitor hates to tie. But if I can be permitted a moment of partisan pride on behalf of my old school, I do want to say that an undefeated season is an achievement that stands on its own and speaks for itself.

As this audience very well knows, you can't break the spirit or erase the record of a fine team with one vote on a bowl bid. And I would go on from there to say by the same token you can't break the spirit or erase the achievements of a great President.

That's why I am proud to be joining President Nixon's team at this very challenging and demanding time in our Nation's history. The last-string benchwarmer from Whittier College who attended this dinner and received your gold medal award four years ago has shown himself to be much more than just America's number one football fan. He has also provided one of the finest examples in my knowledge of how to translate the values of teamwork and leadership we learn on the gridiron into the daily business of life.

It may have been third and long yardage for the President a few weeks ago, but it's first and ten now. And with your help I know he will continue driving straight across the goal line.

I know that I speak not only for myself but for the President when I extend the warmest thanks and commendation to the National Football Foundation for the outstanding work you are doing to keep alive in this country the spirit of sportsmanship and of fair competition which we need so much not only on the playing field but also in the arenas of business, government, and professional life. America is greatly indebted to you for this important contribution.

And now -- because I have seen enough John Wayne movies to know that anyone who keeps The Duke waiting is asking for trouble -- I want to yield the floor for the main presentation of the evening. Thank you very much.

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
