OPENING REMARKS FOR THE ANNUAL INTERNATIONAL SUNSHINE CUP MATCH.

FINALS TO BE TELECAST ON SATURDAY, DECEMBER 29th, CHANNEL 2,

MIAMI, FLORIDA.

As Vice President of the United States, I am pleased to welcome the junior tennis players from 30 nations who have come to Miami Beach to compete in friendly competition for the Annual International Sunshine Cup Matches.
