

(Rev. Cox says the following)

"This is the day which the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad in it"

We do indeed rejoice, for we are gathered here in respect to a decision Mike and Gayle have made to share their lives with one another. We are about to witness a public proclamation of their commitment to one another in Christ. We rejoice with them at this important moment in their lives and glorify God for His grace to this couple in saving them, and drawing them to one another.

Christian marriage is to be held in honor by all for it was God Himself who instituted marriage and that he did for a purpose. We read in the first book of the Bible that "it is not good that man should be alone, I will make him a helper fit for him." Each is to have an attitude of love, forgiveness and respect for his or her mate. (Then Rev. Cox addresses the congregation)
Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support and uphold this marriage in the years ahead? If so please answer "We will."

(Then the congregation responds) We will
