Bob Marik has passed along your memorandum regarding our polling and future polling of blacks.

While I tend to agree with you and have seen some evidence to support the idea that there is a growing dissatisfaction with the Democratic Party among blacks, I have not seen any evidence to indicate that we are picking up any significant numbers of either anti-Democratic or pro-Nixon votes. There is some evidence that various state and local Republican candidates are attracting increasing numbers of blacks both for anti-Democratic and pro-candidate reasons. In order for the President to take advantage of any anti-Democratic sentiment that exists he is going to have to be perceived as at least sympathetic with and not anti-black. There is some evidence to indicate that a number of blacks now perceive him as being against many things that they see as being important to their success in this society.

As you know, we are just completing a series of polls in which we made some effort in the large states to measure attitudes of blacks toward the President and will have that data available later this month.
