Each speaker need only stay for his portion of the program.

The program is balanced and divided into three equal sections, with each speaker addressing himself to one of the following: (1) Economic impact of State of Union and outlook for 1976; (2) Domestic issues and programs outlined in State of Union and outlook for 1976; (3) Budget briefing on new budget and relative implications. The President is expected to make brief general remarks at the outset of two of the sessions.

As you are aware, you are scheduled for three of the Constituency Briefings that Bill Baroody has set up on the afternoons of January 22, 23 and 26.


Dick Cheney had been scheduled for the morning briefing sessions for these same days:
