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PROPOSED CHANGES TO DRAFT DECISION MEMORANDUM

1. Page 1. At the end of the section on the Issue, delete the last sentence "Future increments technology " and replace it with the following:

In any case, however, a commitment would be made now] to commercialize centrifuge technology for future increments to be built by the private sector.

with Bob Seamans

I would suggest covering the following points with Bob Seamans:

1. Schedule, Papers and Procedures, Responsibilities.

- . Glenn Schleede had delivered to you yesterday the work plan and schedule that has been delivered to the President.
- . There is a possibility that the ending date may be moved up from June 25 to June 23.24. That were up to
- . I want to be sure that we are in agreement on schedules and responsibilities -- particularly because the President has put such a high priority on this whole matter.
- . We are looking primarily to ERDA to maintain contacts and discussions on a continuing basis with UEA people. If you haven't begun meeting with UEA (which they haven't), I'd suggest doing so today.
- . The entire Senior staff at the White House is fully aware of this whole matter and will participate in getting everything put together as early as possible next week.
- . Meetings have begun with Congressional leaders (Pastore) and the President wants this intensified.
- . Schleede tells me that he is getting material for the fact sheet and Q&A's from your people today. We must have those in near final form here on Monday because they will be needed in briefings (Congress, Press, Business and Labor Groups, Foreign representatives, etc.)
- . We are looking for the other materials from ERDA on Monday:
 - . Draft Presidential statement
 - . Draft legislation.
 - . Issue papers on any outstanding policy questions that must be resolved (e.g., foreign investments; additional steps to assure a commercial market)
 - . The draft "Request for Proposals" for the centrifuge follow-on plants -- (goes to OMB).
 - . Draft Economic Impact Statement
 - ./Schedules for completing (1) Environmental Impact statement, and (2) the NRC regulatory review.

. We expect to be working very closely with you and other ERDA people on all these papers as they are refined.

2. Briefings

- . The President feels strongly that we have a major educational and selling job to do.
- . The President was impressed with Bob Fri's grasp of the problem and we hope that he will be able to spend a major share of his time in assisting you and the rest of us in getting the briefing and selling job done. Particularly important over the next 3 weeks.

3. Legassie

- . We are going to need some expert help working here closely with us -- (1) to make sure that everyone has a full understanding of the subject matter, and (2) to help get all the papers in final form.
- . We understand that you have Roger Legassie more than committed on other work -- including the Energy R&D Plan which is due June 30, but we think his participation is crucial to making sure this whole effort comes off well.
- . We'd like to have you detail him--at least on a part-time basis--to the Domestic Council for the next 2 to 3 weeks. Also, his thorough grasp of all aspects of the matter -- especially of the steps needed to make privatization work -- will make his participation in briefings essential in the weeks and months ahead.

Other matters that may come up

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- . A "Cut-off" or "Guillotine" date. Seamans will probably push for a single December 31, 1975 date -- which I believe is unnecessary and basically inconsistent with the plan we are now following. This subject is discussed in the Q&A at Tab A, which Connor has reviewed.
- . Work on the 5-million unit add-on plant design. This is discussed at Tab B.
 - (I have given both papers to Bob Fri and Tenny Johnson).

My impressions from yesterday's meeting with Tenney Johnson and his Board:

- . Seamans is still a reluctant bride and may not yet have a good grasp of the proposal.
- . The ERDA bureaucracy is beginning to understand the decision but is slow in adjusting to it.
- . Tenney Johnson is over is head -- but in the absence of Roger Legassie -- he's apparently the only one that Seamans and Fri have to look to and who they can count on to be loyal to their interests in getting the President's decision carried out.

You may want to offer me up to go over and sit down with Seamans and Fri and run over the details of the schedule.

Is there a specified "cut-off" date when, if the UEA project seemed to falter, the Government would decide to seek authorization and appropriations for an add-on diffusion plant at Portsmouth?

First, the risk of UEA failure is considered minimal. Second, there is no one specified, pre-set date for such a decision. The approach that has been selected by the President calls for a major committment to assure privatization of the next increment of capacity, and the full efforts of the Executive Branch will be devoted to assure the success of the approach.

The approach contemplates very close monotoring by the Government at all stages to assure that the Government could step in if the privatization effort threatened to fail -- an event that is considered unlikely. This close monitoring will prevent any significant loss of time, if something were to go wrong, and thus assure that additional capacity can be brought on line by the time it is needed in the 1983-84 time period.

If the Government had to step in, the question of the plant that would be built (5 million unit add-on plant, or a 9 million unit free-standing plant) would depend on when intervention proved necessary. Some examples will illustrate the point:

- . If Congress failed to pass the authorizing legislation needed for the private enrichment industry approach and instead, passed authorization and appropriations for a Government plant, it probably would be desirable to proceed with the add-on plant approach.
- . UEA will be proceeding with all necessary arrangements for its planned plant(including design, power supply, etc.) while the Congress acts on the President's proposal. If at some time prior to March 1976 when UEA is expected to complete financial, customer and power supply arrangements, UEA found that it could not proceed, the Government would need to determine whether it would be best to proceed with a 5 million unit add-on plant or with the 9-million unit free standing plant.
- Government finds it necessary to step in and assume UEA assets and liabilities, the Government would have to decide the best step. At some point it would undoubtedly be the case that it will be more advantageous for the Government to proceed with the free-standing plant than to revert to an add-on plant.

Because of the arrangements that have been designed, it would be inappropriate to pick a <u>single</u> "cut-off" date. To do so could have the effect of encouraging those who prefer a Government plant to the President's decision to seek delays until the date is reached. Furthermore, a <u>single</u> date would be inconsistent with the basic plan and is unnecessary since the plan provides for close and constant monitoring so that actions can be taken in time to prevent delays in bringing the plant on line beyond the date that it is needed.

.

In light of the President's decision to proceed with immediate privatization of uranium enrichment, what work will be done and what will not be done on the proposed 5 million unit add-on diffusion plant?

. Work already underway includes:

- Conceptual design work for the plant (Not Title I or II)

- Preliminary discussions with power suppliers (This work is being financed from a \$5 million ERDA appropriation which also pays for work on the centrifuge demonstration program.)

- Work that will be continued and which does not require either additional authorization or appropriations includes:
 - Continue conceptual design work for the add-on plant.
 - Begin discussions with suppliers to get information on materials and equipment availability, scheduling and prices. Perhaps discuss contract terms.
 - Continue discussions with electric power supplier.
 - Work that would not be done. -- which might have been undertaken if the President selected the add-on plant option -- includes:
 - Anything requiring additional authorization or expanded appropriations, such as:
 - Title I and Title II design work.
 - Long lead time procurement.
 - Actions that might compete for supplies, equipment or resources that will be needed to proceed expeditiously with the privatization option selected by the President.
