TALKING POINTS:

1. Mike will discuss with you a personal and private trip to China for himself. President Nixon had told him he would try and arrange such a trip. The NSC tells me that the Chinese have indicated a reluctance to receive Mansfield this summer since it would create the impression they were sponsoring Cambodia peace negotiations.

HAKM

The PRC does not want to get involved in such negotiations at this time. They did indicate, however, receptivity in principle to a Mansfield trip later in the fall.

RECOMMENDATION: That you tell Mike we are trying to work out a Kissinger trip to China this fall and if and when he goes you will tell Henry to try and set up a trip for Mansfield later in the fall.

2. Mansfield will probably urge you to take a trip to Mexico. He has had a long-standing interest in Mexico and has some very good friends there.

RECOMMENDATION: This is a very interesting and good idea, Mike, I will see what I can do.
