As one of the first White House social events of the year, it has been traditional for the President to host an annual reception/dinner for Federal judges. This practice was discontinued in the last Administration, apparently resulting in some adverse comments within the judicial branch. It would seem that the reinstatement of this annual event would be a salutary action. Even though it would not be possible for all judges to attend, it would serve as a statement of the President's spirit of cooperation and communication among all branches of government, consistent with the Canons of Judicial Ethics.
