State Dinners

At the Hussein Dinner we were allocated 18 Members (36 people counting spouses) out of 60 couples (120 people). We divided the guests evenly between Republicans and Democrats and invited 10 Representatives and 8 Senators.

If continued, this Congressional quota seems reasonable and enables you to cover leaders, senior members and some of your friends in Congress.

This office prepares guest recommendations and submits them to you for personal approval. The Social Office then extends invitations to the approved list.

I recommend you approve, as policy, a Congressional quota of 18 Members plus spouses for major White House events.
