Follow-up to several inquiries you made this morning:

1. General Scowcroft will arrange for a telephone hook-up so you can talk with Secy. Kissinger when he lands at Andrews AFB Tuesday evening. His current arrival time is 7:30 EDT (6:30 p.m. in Kansas City). As it happens, you will be in your hotel suite for personal time then. However, Kissinger's plans are subject to change.

2. General Scowcroft feels it impossible to have a successful conversation between the Secretary and Rep. Brademas over secure voice communications from the Mid-East. Since any discussions would be sensitive this idea has been cancelled.

3. Upon reflection, I recommend against turning out the Cabinet and GOP leaders for Henry's arrival. First, it is a bad time for everybody. Second, the leaders will be reluctant to attend unless the President is returning. Third, the Cabinet saw him off and may feel the significance of his return doesn't merit a large public reception. If you feel differently, however, let me know.
