House

John Moss	Concerned about the President's recent proposal for commercial oil production at the Navy's Elk Hills; feels that a commercial openup would hugely benefit private oil interests without guaranteeing more energy or lower costs to consumers; hopes the President will decide to make no recommendation to Congress in this respect.
James R. Jones	Endorses the request of the Governor of Oklahoma that the President declare eight counties eligible for disaster assistance because of the flooding.
Paul Findley	When the President begins negotiations with the East Germans and the Soviets for most-favored-nation status for their nations, hopes that he will attempt to secure their support for a more favorable status for the people of West Berlin and a guarantee of freer exchange of people and ideas between West Germany and East Germany.
Sam Steiger	Sends a book of poems to the President from Bob Goforth.
Robt Lagomarsino	Recommends that Wm Penn Mott, Jr. be appointed as Director of the Nat'l Park Service.
Floyd Spence	Recommends that Emily T. Owens be appointed to the Advisory Council of Women's Educational Program
Floyd Spence	Supports invitation to the President to address the Southeastern Regional Convention of the Propeller Club in April, 1975.
Joseph Minish	Urges the President to intercede with the Soviet Government in behalf of Valentyn Moroz.
Clair Burgener	Urges the President to sign the Veterans Educational Benefits legislation.

Kika de la Garza	Urges that everything possible be done to make fertilizer available to the farmers.
Goodloe Byron	Urges that the Labor-Management Committee include a member of the agriculture community.
Edward Roybal	Recommends that Arthur H. Maslansky be appointed to the Commodity Futures Trading Commission.
Edward Roybal	Recommends that Wm Penn Mott be appointed as Director of the National Park Service.
Fortney Stark	Hopes that the President will serve as Honorary International Chairman of Beep Baseball for the blind.
Ella Grasso	Supports the request of the National Utility Contractors Association, Inc., that the President direct the EPA to release a substantial portion of the yet-unobligated funds provided for constructing public waste and sewage treatment plants and other water pollution abatement projects.
Charles Mosher	Encloses letter addressed to the President from Eugene Gado regarding his concrete invention.
Frank Horton	Asks the President to use his influence to bring an end to the unconscionable imprisonment of Ukrainian dissidents.
John Rhodes	Recommends that Mrs. Florence Mahoney be appointed to the Advisory Council of the National Institute of Aging.
Bo Ginn	Forwards copy of his telegram from the Executive Director of the AA CAA offering its services to the President to combat inflation.
Donald Brotzman	Asks that consideration be given to letter to the President from the Colorado Cattlemen's Association requesting a meeting with the President.

James Hastings	Asks that the President write to the editor of the New York <u>Post Journal</u> commending him for his efforts to save energy and whip inflation.
Garner Shriver	Encloses correspondence with the President of Beech Aircraft Corporation explaining the Corporation's efforts to win the fight against inflation.
Garner Shriver	Asks that consideration be given to enclosed letters from his constituents expressing concern about the actions of the CIA in Chile.
Kenneth Gray	Asks that a Presidential message be sent to Mrs. Nancy Batts.
Robert McCloskey <i>Check with Anthony Amatore</i>	Requests that a golf ball, ski hat or some such article be supplied for auctioning at a fund-raising affair for Lake Forest Academy on Feb 8, 1975.
Bob Ginn	Recommends that Emerson Gay be appointed to serve on the White House Conference on Agriculture.
John Jarman	Joins with the Governor in requesting that the President declare certain Oklahoma counties eligible for disaster assistance.
The Speaker	Joins in the request of Governor Hall that certain Oklahoma counties be declared eligible for disaster assistance.

Charles McC. Mathias	Endorses the request of Emanuel Levine that the President send a congratulatory message to John D. Schapiro, President of the Laurel Race Course, on the occasion of the 23rd running of the Washington, D. C. International Race that will take place on November 9.
Mark Hatfield	Asks that the President intercede with President Park in behalf of Sp/4 Terry Mathews who is serving a 10-year sentence in Suwon Prison, Seoul.
Warren Magnuson Henry Jackson and Congressmen Meeds, Floyd Hicks, Joel Pritchard	Urge the President to designate the Washington fishing industry eligible for disaster assistance because of the economic crisis confronting the fishermen as a consequence of the so-called Boldt Indian Fishing Rights decision of Feb 12, 1974.
Henry Bellmon	Requests that the President declare portions of Oklahoma affected by flooding, eligible for disaster assistance.
Robert Taft	Recommends that Jack C. Dawson be appointed as a member of the President's Physical Fitness Program.
Robert Taft	Sends letter he rec'd from L. E. Thompson regarding inflation.
Lister Hill (former Senator)	Hopes the President will be able to accept invitation from the Board of Directors of the Lister Hill Center in Montgomery to speak on December 8.
Peter Dominick	Recommends that Foster J. Wendt be appointed as Regional Director of the Denver Office of Economic Opportunity.
Mark Hatfield	Recommends that Kenneth Wooden be appointed to the Nat'l Advisory Committee for Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention.
Robert Taft	Recommends that Fernando Oaxaca be appointed as Assistant Secretary for Administration, Dept of Commerce.

Marlow Cook	Encloses copy of letter from Mary P. Finnegan who is opposed to the 5 percent surtax.
John Sparkman	Sends copy of letter addressed to the President from Barrett C. Shelton who is very concerned about the possibility of a coal strike.
Bill Brock	Asks that the President autograph photographs for two persons.
Wm Scott	Recommends that Wm B. Cummings be appointed as U. S. Attorney for the Eastern District of Virginia.
Jennings Randolph	Recommends that Richard D. Grundy be appointed as Commissioner of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission.
Adlai Stevenson	Urges the President to discuss control of nuclear power with Secretary Brezhnev; also urges the President to give the highest priority to reviewing the adequacy of U.S. and int'l safeguards against nuclear proliferation, and to report to the Congress in the near future.
Pete Domenici	Hopes the President will be able to accept invitation to deliver keynote address at the International Conference on Community Education on the campus of New Mexico State University.
