Dear Mildred:

Although the tumult and the shouting will probably never die around the White House, hopefully you are getting used to the noise by this time. Although the President seems to be getting a little flack for not moving rapidly enough, I certainly concur with the cool and deliberate way he is handling things. I have owned several large schooners and power boats, and handling anything big requires no violent manoevers. If you are coming into the dock a little bit wrong, it is better to scrape a bit of paint off the dock or the boat, than it is to p the throttles full ahead or full astern, as that usually just gets you into more trouble.

Eva is diligently rehearsing a play, "Arsenic and Old Lace" which she and her sister Zsa Zsa will open in Chicago on the 20th of February.

I shall be coming alone to Washington on about the 24th of January to attend the Alfalfa dinner on the 25th, and would very much like an opportunity to pay my respects to Mr. Ford over a cup of coffee or a drink anytime on the 24th, 25th, or the 4 or 5 days after that. The weather probably won't permit golf at Burning Tree, but if it does, that would be a great pleasure on Sunday.
