MEMORANDUM FOR THE PRESIDENT

SUBJECT: Rep. Bill Broomfield (R-Mich.)

Congressman Broomfield phoned you today and I returned the call as you were occupied with a meeting.

Rep. Broomfield said he called you at the urging of Senator Griffin to make two recommendations:

1. The appointment of Edith Green to a Cabinet post. Broomfield said Mrs. Green would be loyal and effective and a much better appointment than Martha Griffiths.
2. To assemble once a month a Congressional memo for your eyes from Members who have something for you personally. Bill commented that 99 per cent of the material would be routine, but occasionally there might be something useful for you.

I told Congressman Broomfield I would pass along your comments and he said that would be sufficient and he would not need to talk to you.
