SUBJECT: Boards and Commissions
Vacancy Report

There are 2,542 possible Presidential appointments to part time Boards and Commissions: 1,048 Without Compensation (WOC); 1,191 Compensated when Actually Employed (WAE); and 303 Ad Hoc appointees who serve the Government in another capacity. Of this total, 213 vacancies will not be staffed. The following is the status of Presidentially appointed part time Boards and Commissions:
