Forwards House Resolution 72 requiring the delivery of certain information delivered to the President by William E. Colby on Dec 26, 1974, relating to certain activities of the CIA. Requests that the President advise the Committee on Armed Services of his intentions in the matter.

James Collins

Encloses an open letter to the Speaker of the House, the Vice President and the President from his constituent who feels that the development of ore reserves containing materials that will more effectively harness Nuclear Energy is just as important to our future energy independence as the development of the fuel reserves.

Joshua Eilberg

Calls the President's attention to the importance for the State of Pennsylvania of increased federal funding for construction of water pollution control facilities. Urges the President to release the appropriated monies for the State and local communities.

Don Clausen

Urges the President to release the \$9 billion of authorized funds for sewage treatment works construction, and that the \$4 billion already released should be immediately allotted to the individual States in accordance with allotment formulas specified in the law for these sums; suggests that the President designate a member of the White House staff who could discuss these matters on a continuing basis with the Committee on Public Works and Transportation.

John Paul Hammerschmidt Believes that one of the most important concerns is to foster scientific and technical research and development activities which can play a major role in resolving many of our national problems in areas such as energy.

Dante Fascell

Asks that the President give consideration to the Southeastern Fisheries Association's request for a 90-day moratorium on all imported shrimp products and the establishment of a commission to study the problems posed for the domestic shrimp industry by imports.
