Bennett Johnston	Attaches the results of the public opinion survey which Doug Manship's newspaper made, together with a letter from Manship to the President.
Howard Baker	Endorses recommendation of the California Press Bureau that the President name George Jessel for the Presidential Medal of Freedom.
Howard Baker	Hopes the President will have his energy advisors review the potential impact of the energy conservation program upon the asphalt industry to insure that all appropriate relief is afforded them.
Hugh Scott	Hopes the President will be able to accept invitation to address the annual dinner of the Pennsylvania Environment Council.
Thomas McIntyre	Recommends that James R. Bucknam be appointed to the National Highway Safety Advisory Committee.
Ted Stevens Cliff Hansen	Sends the President a cartoon that "your friends in United's Red Carpet Room in Denver had on the bulletin board."
J. Glenn Beall	Ask that the President intercede with the Soviet Government in behalf of Dr. Illia Glezer, who has been incarcerated in the Soviet Union and is now being sent for three additional years in Siberia.
Harrison Williams Jacob Javits	Recommends that Benno C. Schmidt be appointed to another term on the President's Cancer Panel.
Howard Cannon	Recommends that Patrick Healy be appointed as Secretary of Housing and Urban Development.
Harry Byrd	Supports invitation to the President to attend the Fifth Annual July 4th Celebration of the Kiwanis Club of Colonial Heights.
Henry Jackson	Recommends that George Jessel receive the Presidential Medal of Freedom.

Sam Nunn	Supports invitation to the President to be the keynote speaker for the United Methodist Council on Evangelism in Philadelphia on January 4.
Pete Domenici	Recommends that Sheila S. Blair be appointed to the International Women's Year Commission.
John Sparkman	Recommends that Joseph F. Hinchey be appointed to the Advisory Board of the National Credit Union Administration.
Robert Taft	Recommends that Stephen J. Kohn be appointed to the National Commission on Electronic Fund Transfer.
Edmund Muskie William Hathaway	Recommend that Kenneth M. Curtis be appointed to the Board of the new Legal Services Corporation.

Guy Vander Jagt	Recommends that Judge David H. Harris be appointed to the Occupational Safety and Health Commission.
Wm Wampler	Asks that the President submit an emergency request to the Congress for a limited one year revision to the Federal Highway Act that would permit the granting of an additional \$500 million in Federal highway construction funds to the States for 100 percent Federal financing of interstate and intra-state roads.
Tim Lee Carter	Sends gifts to the President from Mr. and Mrs. John Ewing and Mr. Glen Goad.
Seymour Halpern (former M. C.)	Endorses proposal made by Dr. Judianne Densen-Gerber for the establishment of a cabinet level White House Office on the Concerns of Children; Halpern recommends that Dr. Densen-Gerber head up such an agency.
Jack Brinkley	Forwards correspondence to the President from former Major Donald W. Thomas who is unhappy because he has not been permitted to reenlist.
Margaret Heckler	Recommends that John Dellenbeck be appointed to an appropriate position with the Administration.
Leo J. Ryan	Encloses copy of his report which he has submitted to the Foreign Affairs Committee regarding his observations during his trip to Vietnam.
Thomas Morgan	Sends a "Declaration of Dependence" which he asks that the President autograph for Marjorie N. Stoy.
Tim Lee Carter	Supports invitation to the President to speak at the 38th Annual Assembly of the Southeastern Hospital Conference on May 7 in New Orleans.
Thomas Rees	Recommends that George Jessel be awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom.


