
My dear Mr. Vice President:

In accordance with our conversation of July 17, I have talked with Miss Leonard in your office. She has indicated to me today that you would like to meet sometime early in September, preferably in one of your conference rooms. I suggested to her that we would arrange to have several of our Board Members at such a meeting, which would include some of the following: Trammell Crow of Dallas, Chairman of our Board; Disque D. Deane, Chairman of our Executive Committee; Charles B. Benenson, Vice Chairman and Alton G. Marshall, all of New York; A. Alfred Taubman of Southfield, Michigan; Robert H.
