I. PURPOSE

To give the chief executives of 23 key companies owning groups of television and radio stations throughout the United States an opportunity to meet the President, following a White House briefing on economic and energy issues and a discussion on other issues of interest to broadcasters.

Group broadcasting stations represent a significant segment of the media not reached directly through other White House briefings and communications efforts.
