Joseph Fisher	Urge appointment of Carl W. Clewlow to the Civil Service Commission.
Peter Rodino	Recommends that Lud J. Andolsek be reappointed as Civil Service Commissioner.
Richard Fulton	Recommends that J. William Denny be appointed to the National Commission on New Technological Uses of Copyrighted Works.
Sam Steiger	Recommends that Dr. Andrew S. Adams be retained as Commissioner of Rehabilitation Services of HEW.
James Quillen	Recommends that Dr. Nat Winston be appointed to the Federal Council on Aging.
Wm Hungate	Recommends that Harold S. Klein be appointed to the National Commission on New Technological Uses of Copyrighted Works.
James Broyhill	Supports invitation to the President to address the DECA's Career Development Conference on May 7 or 10 in Hollywood, Florida.
Patsy Mink	Hopes the President will accept the invitation from the National Association of Counties to visit Hawaii this summer to address the NACO Annual Convention in Honolulu.
Yvonne B. Burke	Suggests that the Presidential Medal of Freedom be awarded to George Jessel.

Edith Green	Responds to the recent letter received from the President. Points out that in January she wrote outlining reasons she felt she should not serve on Legal Services Board. However, will do her best if nominated and confirmed. "It is really rather difficult to say "no" to a President!"
Wm. Moorhead	Expresses pleasure that Joseph H. Newman has been nominated to the board of directors of the National Institute of Building Sciences. Recommends Mr. Newman as Chairman.
Robert G. Stephens, Jr.	Recommends Dr. James D. Clements for membership on the President's Committee on Mental Retardation.
Edward J. Patten	Requests 50th wedding anniversary message on April 4 for Mr. and Mrs. Arnold Lybeck.
Bill Archer	Seconds invitation extended to address the Distributive Education Clubs of American 29th Annual Career Development Conference in May.
Alvin Baldus	Is concerned over future funding of Community Services Program, created Jan. 4, 1975. Asks why \$55 million included in FEA budget "to establish a program to offer direct subsidies to low-income homeowners to assist them in the installation of insulation to conserve energy. Urges that this \$55 million be given to the Community Services Administration Budget, with experience in this type of field work.

Requests that the President direct OMB to make additional funds available to SBA for the handicapped loan program .

Norman D'Amours

Provides additional information regarding the denial of a waiver of provisions of the Jones Act to permit the transportation of liquefied natural gas from Alaska to New England.
