Subject: Tax Bill

Barber Conable called at three o'clock to say that the Republicans who voted against the tax bill would be very upset if it is not vetoed. He includes himself in that group.

He recognizes that you did not make a commitment but that all felt that they were doing what you would like to see them do.

He believes that failure to veto would have a very bad affect on Republican morale in terms of fighting spending programs in the future.
