Howard Baker	Encloses letter from the Mayor of the City of Pekin, Illinois, inviting the President to the dedication of the Dirksen Center in Pekin in August. Senator hopes the President's schedule will permit him to accept the invitation.
Richard Stone	Recommends that John Hersey be appointed to the National Commission on New Technological Uses of Copyrighted Works.
Barry Goldwater	Recommends that Bruce Gimbel be appointed to the Civil Aeronautics Board.
Robert Taft	Recommends that David E. Maas be appointed as Deputy Administrator of the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration.
Jim Allen	Recommends that Bobbie L. Walden be appointed to the National Advisory Council On Adult Education.
Bob Dole	Recommends that William A. Taggart be appointed as Special Trade Representative.
Henry Jackson	Recommends that Maryan E. Reynolds be appointed to the National Commission on Libraries and Information Science.
Robert Taft	Recommends that Walter B. Connolly, Jr. be appointed to the position of Under Secretary of Labor.
Paul Fannin	Conveys the views of Merton Jones who is opposed to strip mining.

Morris Udall	Suggests that George Jessel receive the Presidential Medal of Freedom.
Guy Vander Jagt ?	Writes in support of the opposition raised by the State Bar of Michigan to the preliminary list of proposed nominees to the Board of Directors of the Legal Services Corporation.
Thomas O'Neill	Recommends that Richard G. Lee be appointed to the Commission on Federal Paperwork.
M. Caldwell Butler	Recommends that Thomas L. Longshore be appointed to the Board of the Tennessee Valley Authority.
John Murtha	Highly commends Bob Wolthius who accompanied the Congressional delegation on a tour of South Vietnam and Cambodia; says "He is certainly a fine example of a public servant and I appreciate his dedication to duty."
Thad Cochran	Recommends that Ralph J. Marlatt be appointed to be Federal Insurance Administrator.
J. Kenneth Robinson	Supports invitation to the President to visit the experimental solar heating installation at the Fauquier County High School of Warrenton, Virginia.
James O'Hara	Supports invitation to the President to participate in the Tri-Community American Revolution Bicentennial Commission's parade on July 4, 1976.
Edward Boland Silvio O. Conte	On behalf of 24 members of the New England Congressional Caucus, urge the President to restore the product entitlement program which was dropped on Feb 1, at least until the President and the Congress can develop a more permanent and equitable approach to our national energy problems; restoring the product entitlement will hold down the prices of residual and heating oil and facilitate the "tilt" toward gasoline.
