SUBJECT: Ambassadorial Status Report

There are a total of 123 Ambassadors with Embassies, i. e. country ambassadorial posts. Although the U. S. does not have formal diplomatic ties with the Peoples Republic of China (PRC), and therefore no resident ambassador, the U. S. Liaison Office in Peking is listed but not computed in this report.

At the moment, 3 of these 123 posts are vacant and not now occupied by an ambassador. In one of these 3 cases, candidates have been approved but agreement remains outstanding (Tab D). The remaining 2 posts will remain vacant for an indefinite period (Tab F). Therefore, no actual vacancies exist at this time.

There are also a total of 26 ambassadors without embassies, i. e. special ambassadorial assignments. Currently, there are no vacancies (Tab O).

We are actively searching for candidates to replace the ambassadors in Nicaragua (Turner Shelton) and Ireland (John Moore). These two posts have, as described to you in separate memoranda, unusual situations which have stepped up our recruiting and search efforts. The following chart reflects the vacancy percentages and indicates the number of career and non-career candidates:

There are 118 Ambassadors currently at post (Tab H). Two (2) candidates have been announced but not yet confirmed for non-vacant posts (Tab I), and one (1) other has been approved but agreement remains outstanding (Tab J). Two other candidates are in clearance. In 20 other cases there is the potential for change because the incumbent's tenure at post is sufficient to establish eligibility for reassignment or retirement (Tab L). XI.	Since August 10, 1974, there have been 28 (22.7%) ambassadorial announcements (Tab M). Of these, 26 (21.1%) have been confirmed by the Senate (14 Career, 12 Non-Career), 2 others await confirmation, and one (1) nomination (0.8%) has been withdrawn. Bush is listed but not computed as the Peking assignment is not a confirmable position.	
XII.	Between November 8, 1972, and August 10, 1974, 91 (75.2%) ambassadorial announcements were made (Tab N). Eighty-nine (73.5%) were confirmed by the Senate (68 Career, 21 Non-Career), one (0.8%) was withdrawn at the nominee's request (0 Career, 1 Non-Career), and one (0.8%) was withdrawn because the candidate declined to serve. No ambassadorial candidates were rejected by the Senate.
