Senate

1. S Russell Long Asks that expeditious attention be given to Governor Edwards' request for an emergency disaster declaration for eight Louisiana Parishes which are severely flooded.
2. S Strom Thurmond Invites the President to visit both the Savannah River Operations Office of the Energy Research and Development Administration and the E. I. Du Pont De Nemours and Company at some time in the future.

Paul J. Fannin Strongly urge that the President appoint the required members to the Commission on Supplies and Shortages so that they may start their work immediately to meet the June 30 deadline for issuance of its important report. They are very distressed that the March 1 deadline for the report has had to be extended and the members still have not been appointed.
4. S Strom Thurmond General Mark Clark will be visiting Brazil on May 5 as the guest of President Geisel, and would be pleased if the President wishes to send a message through him to President Geisel. Brazil will be celebrating the 30th anniversary of the end of World War II and this would be an excellent time to reaffirm our gratitude for the help Brazil gave the Allied cause.
5. S Floyd Haskell Recommends that Harold E. Hill be appointed to the National Commission on New Technological Uses of Copyrighted Material.
6. S Lloyd Bentsen Recommends that Ms. Sara L. Bolieu be appointed to the National Advisory Committee for the Flammable Fabrics Act to advise the Consumer Product Safety Commission.
7. S Howard Baker Recommends that Dr. Walter R. Guyton be appointed to the Advisory Council of the John F. Kennedy Center.

8. S Barry Goldwater Recommends that Henry Bobbe be appointed to the Commodity Futures Trading Commission.
9. S Barry Goldwater Sends the President a copy of his letter to Chairman Sparkman referring to the President's remarks (in his address to the Joint Session of Congress) regarding whether under the War Limitations Act the President any longer had the power to use our armed forces to relieve American citizens whose lives and property are threatened in foreign countries such as we are witnessing today in Southeast Asia; thinks that this whole matter should receive the prompt attention of the Foreign Policy Committee.
10. S Mike Mansfield Encloses copy of telegram he received from Malcolm Browne regarding the situation in Vietnam.

1. Guy Vander Jagt Hopes the President's schedule will permit him to accept invitation to speak at Hope College in Holland, Michigan, and receive an honorary doctorate.
2. Henry Helstoski Requests the President's intervention with Cuban representative to the UN in obtaining exit visa from Cuban authorities for David Hall of Havana whose sister and brother were recently kidnapped and murdered in Union City, New Jersey.
3. Bob Sikes Is immensely pleased to have the President's autographed photograph.
4. John Zwach Strongly urges the President to sign the farm bill; says that our Party must be prepared to write off the Midwest completely if the bill is vetoed.
5. George Mahon Hopes the President's schedule will permit him to accept invitation to speak at the annual meeting of the Advisory Council of the Small Business Administration which is planned for May 26-29 in Greenbrier, West Virginia.
6. Keith Sebelius Says that farmers are puzzled by the 40 per cent decline in grain prices and the last 6 months of falling farm prices. He supports a modest increase in support levels to restore confidence and to assure producers we are working with them to provide the food and fiber our nation so desperately needs.
7. Alan Steelman Urges the President to call the White House Conference on Libraries as soon as possible so that planning at the state and local levels can begin.
8. James C. Cleveland Recommends that Dr. Kenneth Gerald Johnson be appointed to the National Advisory Council on Health Planning and Development.

9. Pat Jennings Transmits a message from the House of Representatives indicating the appointment as members of the Federal Elections Commission the Honorable Robert O. Tiernan and the Honorable Vernon W. Thomson, their nominations having been confirmed by the House and the Senate.
10. Gerry E. Studds In behalf of the Dartmouth Bicentennial Enlistment Committee, sends the President a Bicentennial document in conjunction with the re-enactment of the Minute Man Ride through local towns.

Hope that the President and/or the Secretary of State will stop in Taiwan en route, or on the return from China. This would show the Chinese on Taiwan that relations will continue to be close and will serve as a symbol to all other small free nations throughout the world that the United States is their friend.
12. Robert N. C. Nix At this time when there is so much immediate interest in foreign investment issues, hopes that CIEP will be retained as the coordinator for policy decision on foreign investment in the U. S. It has developed expertise in this area and was created to serve in such a role. If CIEP does not chair the interagency committee, which the President plans to establish, hopes that it will be a member and provide key staff personnel.
13. Albert Quie Recommends that Orval Hansen be appointed to the National Study Commission on Records and Documents of Federal Officials.

14. John J. Rhodes Endorses Sherman Lloyd for the Federal Trade Commission.
15. Augustus Hawkins Asks that a Presidential message be sent to Mr. and Mrs. Percy Yerian.
16. G. Wm Whitehurst Suggests that the jurisdiction over offshore oil leases be transferred to the Department of Commerce, NOAA.

Clarence J. Brown Asks that the President support legislation they recently introduced, "The Railroad Rights-of-Way Improvement Act," which is designed to put people to work rebuilding railroad rights-of-way. Feel that this demands immediate action.
18. Larry Pressler Urges that a Member of the American Institute of Constructors be appointed to the Board of Directors for the National Institute of Building Sciences.
19. Edwin B. Forsythe Recommends that Albert P. Blaustein be appointed to the National Commission on New Technological Uses of Copyrighted Works.
20. Robert McClory Recommends that Alan Anderson Reich be appointed to an ambassadorial post.
21. Thomas Morgan Encloses two copies of H. Res. 400, directing the President to provide to the House of Representatives certain information respecting U. S. nationals who are presently in South Vietnam; requests comments as soon as possible since the Committee on International Relations must act on this resolution within seven days.
22. Jack Brooks Urges the President to act at once to remove all American citizens from South Vietnam; has been deeply disturbed by the testimony of administration witnesses this week before several congressional committees on this subject.

23. Bill Young Strongly urges that the President direct OMB to give equal treatment and consideration to the construction of a VA hospital in Bay Pines, Florida, along with the other seven that are receiving consideration for other areas.
24. William Widnall Thanks the President and First Lady for the flower arrangement while he was in the hospital; doesn't enjoy retirement, and hopes that the breaks start coming his way soon.
25. Clarence Brown He and Mrs. Brown thoroughly enjoyed last Tuesday evening with the President and Mrs. Ford; Cathy was thrilled with the note to her and shared it the next day with the other students, etc.
26. Charles Bennett Asks for an opportunity to visit with the President for two or three minutes to discuss stockpile matters; that in view of the contents of the letter he received from Acting Asst Secretary John Bennett (Installations and Logistics, in DoD), it is not expected the Subcommittee on Stockpiles, which he chairs, will hold any hearings on stockpile matters until the present conflict in the Executive Branch on this matter has been eliminated.
