You asked this morning for the latest poll information concerning the President's handling of the SS Mayaguez incidents. At this time, data is very sketchy. Neither Gallup nor Harris have published polls since the incident. However, both are presently in the field, Harris should publish his findings by the end of this week and Gallup will publish his results during the first week in June.

Although sketchy, NBC and the RNC have conducted polls which are helpful in indicating opinion trends:

1) NBC conducted a poll on May I3th and 14th (the day before and the day of the return of the Ship) asking this question -- "As you probably know, the new government of Cambodia has seized a U.S. cargo ship in the Gulf of Siam. Do you think we should take military action to get back our ship and crew?" -- The response to this questions was:

YES		65%
NO		20%
NOT	SURE	15%

2) The RNC has conducted three field surveys which shed light on the shift in the President's approval rating based on this incident. These polls have not been completely tabulated and the findings are thus preliminary:
