Was pleased to be informed by the Department of Agriculture that plans have been finalized for construction of the animal quarantine facility at Fleming Key, Florida. Urges approval of the Department of Agriculture's request for supplemental appropriation in order for the Plum Island, New York, Animal Disease Center to provide disease control and eradication programs in Central America. States that expansion of this laboratory is imperative for the operation of the Fleming Key Facility.

1. Martin Russo Expresses concern that the IRS is withdrawing from participation in office space which will be available in new Federal Building to be constructed in Harvey, Illinois. States IRS plans to move its office to Tinley Park which he believes will be detrimental to economy of Harvey.
